[Urging the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency to Enforce Labor Harmony Provisions with Respect to Bauer's Intelligent Transportation, Inc., and its Labor Harmony Violations]

Resolution urging the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) Board and SFMTA Director to deny the Commuter Shuttle Program permit application submitted by Bauer's Intelligent Transportation, Inc., until such time as Bauer's demonstrates full compliance with Labor Harmony, under the provisions of Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 96-15 and Transportation Code, Section 914.

WHEREAS, On March 24, 2015, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco ("City") adopted Resolution No. 96-15, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 150227, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, urging the Board of Directors of the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency ("SFMTA Board") to adopt requirements of permittees of the Commuter Shuttle Program, including a provision that permittees demonstrate and maintain labor harmony as a condition of their voluntary participation in the Commuters Shuttle Program; and

WHEREAS, The Labor Harmony provision was based on the City's need for assurances that the orderly and regulated use of private commuter shuttles in conjunction with the operations of the SFMTA's Muni bus service ("Muni") would not hinder or impede standard Muni operations or cause unsafe conditions for private vehicles, cyclists or pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 96-15 urges the SFMTA Board to provide for enforcement, including revocation of city-issued permits, in instances where permittees' voluntary participation in the Commuter Shuttle Program is occasioned by disruptions, including those arising from labor disputes; and

WHEREAS, On November 17, 2015, the SFMTA Board formally adopted an enhanced Commuter Shuttle Program and thereby amended Transportation Code, Section 914; and

WHEREAS, Permits issued through the Commuter Shuttle Program are conditioned upon continued compliance with all requirements as set forth by the SFMTA Board and Director, including adherence to the principles set forth in Resolution No. 96-15; and

WHEREAS, The Commuter Shuttle Program requires that a permittee must ensure its operations do not cause or contribute to Muni disruption or threaten public safety, with an understanding that failure to comply with these requirements can result in permit revocation; and

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Section 914(d)(9)(a), requires permittees to provide plans for the prevention of disruptions to service, including subpart (v) which requires permittees to identify their efforts to maintain positive employment relationships with their shuttle drivers and otherwise address the principles set forth in Resolution No. 96-15; and

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Section 914(h)(4), sets forth the terms and conditions of the Commuter Shuttle Program permits and provides that permittees shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws; and

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Section 914(k)(1-4), establishes the grounds for suspension or revocation of a permit by the Director, upon written notice to a permittee and with the opportunity for a hearing; and

WHEREAS, The Commuter Shuttle Program's requirements went into effect on February 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Bauer's Intelligent Transportation, Inc. ("Bauer's") has voluntarily engaged in the Commuter Shuttle Program as a permittee and beneficiary of the privileges associated with regulated use of the City's public transit infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Bauer's continues to be engaged in a protracted labor dispute, including complaints on file with the National Labor Relations Board, labor litigation in federal court and administrative proceedings (*e.g.* 20-CA-148119; 20-RC-150089; 20-CA-151225, 20-CA-160321, 20-CA-161534, 20-CA-167627 and 15-CV-03829 (JST) (N.D.Cal); and

WHEREAS, Bauer's involvement in its labor dispute has resulted in a failure to adhere to the requirements of the Commuter Shuttle Program including the Labor Harmony provision of Resolution No. 96-15; and

WHEREAS, Bauer's protracted labor dispute has caused disruption to Muni operations, impeded access to and threatened the safety of the public in their attempts to utilize cityowned and maintained bus stops identified within the Commuter Shuttle Program; and

WHEREAS, A denial of Bauer's permit application for participation in this voluntary program does not, in any way, prevent or restrict Bauer's continued operation of its business as a private licensed commuter shuttle company outside the scope of the Commuter Shuttle Program; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors, the SFMTA Board and the SFMTA Director are empowered and obliged to secure the public health, safety and welfare of the people of San Francisco and their unimpeded access to and operation of the public Muni transit system, prioritizing the public's well-being over the accommodation and convenience of private shuttle companies whose participation in the Commuter Shuttle Program is voluntary and conditional; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds that Bauer's continued participation in the Commuter Shuttle Program during the pendency of its labor dispute will disrupt public access and use of the Muni bus system and its citywide infrastructure, threaten public safety and disrupt routine Muni bus operations, which average 700,000 passenger boardings on a typical day; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That, for the foregoing reasons, the Board of Supervisors urges the SFMTA Board and the SFMTA Director to deny the permit application submitted by Bauer's Intelligent Transportation, Inc. for participation in the Commuter Shuttle Program until such time as Bauer's can demonstrate compliance with the Labor Harmony provision laid out in Resolution No. 96-15 and the requirements of the Commuter Shuttle Program.
