Resolution authorizing the Sheriff's Department to apply for a three-year grant in an amount not to exceed \$ 5,000,000 from the State Board of Corrections for Mentally III Offenders Crime Reduction (MIOCR) Demonstration Program; and approving the membership of the MIOCR Strategy Committee.

WHEREAS, Due to the deinstitutionalization of severely mentally ill individuals that occurred in the 1970's, many mentally ill people now remain untreated, resulting in impaired functioning, poverty, homelessness and self-medication with alcohol and controlled substances; and,

WHEREAS, These behaviors often necessitate police intervention resulting in incarceration; and,

WHEREAS, The State Board of Corrections has made available funding, through Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction grants, for development of programs designed to reduce jail crowding, crime and criminal justice costs, while addressing the needs of mentally ill offenders during incarceration and upon release; and,

WHEREAS, The State requires that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Sheriff to apply for such funding; and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the grant application and companion Local Plan will be filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 010284; and,

WHEREAS, Indirect costs are requested at a rate of 10% percent of the total grant application; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby appoints Sheriff **Michael Hennessey** Chair of the San Francisco Mentally III Offender

Supervisor Sandoval

Crime Reduction Strategy Committee; and authorizes Sheriff **Michael Hennessey** to submit and/or to sign San Francisco County's application for State funding as well as related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of California; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the appointment of the following individuals or their designees as members of the San Francisco Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction Strategy Committee: Ron Albers, Deputy Public Defender; Cynthia Caporizzo, Mayor's Criminal Justice Council; Armando Cervantes, Chief Adult Probation Officer; Officer Mike Cowhig, San Francisco Police Department; David Fariello, LCSW, Director, Citywide Case Management; Barbara Garcia, Director, Population, Health and Prevention; Barbara Havassy, Director, UCSF Treatment Outcome Research Group; Michael Lund, Citywide Case Management; Jean M. Mariani, Chief Financial Officer, San Francisco Sheriff's Department; Jo Robinson, MFCC, Director, Jail Psychiatric Services; Jo Ruffin, LCSW, Director, Community Mental Health Services; Honorable Ksenia K. Tsenin, Judge of the Municipal Court; Keith Vines, Assistant District Attorney; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco will not supplant MIOCR Demonstration Grant funds; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco intends to enter into an agreement with the State, relative to the expenditure of funds, and program implementation and evaluation should a grant award be forthcoming by not later than June 30, 2001; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco will adhere to the requirements of the Board of Corrections and all conditions specified in the grant contract with the State of California in the expenditure of State funds received pursuant to said application; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco will participate in the collection of required common research data, program evaluation activities and conduct an evaluation of their proposed project; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County of San Francisco certifies that it will invoice the Board of Corrections for all costs approved in the grant on a quarterly basis beginning October 1, 2001 and not later than October 15, 2004.
