WHEREAS, The State Court of Appeal's decision in this matter was perceived to be a watershed decision that could affect the status of inclusionary housing ordinances across the State; and,

WHEREAS, The Court last week rejected the developers' challenge to the law, ruling that Napa's ordinance upholds the "important governmental interest of providing affordable housing;" and,

WHEREAS, This decisions supports San Francisco's efforts to enact inclusionary housing laws that will hopefully combat many of the social problems associated with homelessness and poverty; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby commends the California Court of Appeal First Appellate District for rejecting a challenge by housing developers to a Napa, California inclusionary housing law that requires low-cost units in every new housing development.
