Resolution in support of Assembly Bill 2324 regarding Public Transit Facilities, making

WHEREAS, During the first four months of this year, there were over 100 criminal incidents reported each month on Muni, including assault, robbery, and graffiti; and,

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 2324, introduced by Assembly Member John A. Perez (D-Los Angeles), aims to strengthen security for individuals who use buses, trains and other public transportation systems; and,

WHEREAS, AB2324 would create a new crime and make it a misdemeanor for any person to knowingly possess specified weapons at a public transit vehicle facility and prohibits a person from intentionally engaging in dangerous activities that can jeopardize the safety of transit personnel and passengers; and,

WHEREAS, The Assembly Bill would also prohibit a person from intentionally avoiding screening and inspection when entering areas of an airport or passenger vessel terminal which is generally controlled in a manner consistent with that public transit authority's security plan; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has several efforts underway to improve safety for public transit riders, including a partnership between the Municipal Transportation Agency (MTA) and San Francisco Police Department (SFPD); and,

WHEREAS, Local efforts coupled with statewide legislation will send a strong message to the community that no crimes will be tolerated in our public transit areas; and,

WHEREAS, AB2324 is currently pending a vote in the Senate after being passed unanimously by the Assembly, Senate Public Safety Committee and Senate Appropriations Committee; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco supports AB2324 and urges Governor Schwarzenegger to sign AB2324 if passed.
