Thank you to Supervisor Peskin for introducing a motion on 10/23 to restore remote public comment at Board of Supervisors committee meetings.

I am writing to urge all members of the Rules Committee to support this motion. I also urge the Committee to schedule this item for the next Rules Committee meeting when it can be on the agenda. Remote public comment is widely supported by a diverse group of people and organizations, evidenced by the 80+ organizations that signed the <u>campaign letter</u> sent out to the Board of Supervisors last month.

- Reasonable accommodation (allowing remote comment on an individual basis) is a cumbersome and unworkable solution.
- Giving real-time comments (rather than through a letter or email) on issues before a committee is often the last opportunity before a vote is taken.
- Restoring remote public comment only in committee meetings would be less of a lightning rod for hate speech and would allow the Board to manage comments that are not germane to the specific agenda item.

Restoring remote public comment ensures that a wide variety of community members can participate and make their voices heard. Especially those who would otherwise be underrepresented in favor of those with the privilege of sufficient resources and/or less personal risk to physically attend at city hall.
