URGING THE SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS TO MAINTAIN DIVERSITY AND EQUAL OPPORTUNITY IN SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Unified School District recently agreed to stop using race based admissions criteria as part of an out-of-court settlement of a lawsuit; and,

WHEREAS, this settlement ended a 15-year-old desegregation policy of setting percentage limits on ethnic groups at individual schools; and,

WHEREAS, this settlement will likely cause the school district to lose \$37 million in state funding for equal education programs, money that was used to equalize academic opportunities for disadvantaged students; and,

WHEREAS, research indicates that a number of school districts where court-ordered desegregation plans have ended have seen a return to segregation; and

WHEREAS, at Lowell High School, one of San Francisco's top schools, African American students will make up 2.5% of the entering class in 1999-2000 versus 7% in 1998-1999 and Spanish surname students will make up 7% of the entering class in 1999-2000 versus 14% in 1998-1999 as a result of new race neutral admission criteria; and, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the San Francisco School Board and the Superintendent of schools to research methods being used in other

school districts to maintain diversity and equal opportunity for disadvantaged students without using race-based admission criteria; and, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the San Francisco School Board and Superintendent of schools to work to keep all schools, including top ones, integrated by using such means as redrawing school boundaries and giving enrollment preferences based on socioeconomic status; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the San Francisco School Board and Superintendent of schools to maintain programs to assist disadvantaged students to create equal opportunities for all students.
