

1 [Contract for, Accept, and Expend Grant - Criminal Restitution Compact - Up to \$256,974]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Office of the District Attorney to contract for, accept and**

4 **expend up to \$256,974 allocated from the California Victim Compensation and**

5 **Government Claims Board for a project entitled the Criminal Restitution Compact for**

6 **the period of July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2016.**

7 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco desires to enter into an agreement

8 with the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board in accordance with

9 Government Section 13835 for the purpose of ensuring that restitution fines and orders are

10 properly administered; and

11 WHEREAS, Funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant local funds that

12 would, in the absence of California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board

13 Programs, be made available to support the assistance of victims and witnesses of crime;

14 and,

15 WHEREAS, All positions supported by these funds shall be coded "G" in the District

16 Attorney's budget; and

17 WHEREAS, The District Attorney proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on

18 program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; and

19 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance

20 (ASO); now, therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED, That the District Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco, or his

22 designee, is authorized on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco to contract for,

23 accept and expend funds from the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims

24 Board to continue the Criminal Restitution Compact; including any extensions, augmentations

25 or amendments thereof; and, be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
2 indirect costs in the grant budget.
