

1 [Improve pedestrian safety in San Francisco by coordinating citywide and targeted
2 community-based safety campaigns.]

3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) to**
4 **accept and expend retroactively a grant in the amount of \$319,706 from the California**
5 **Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) to improve pedestrian safety in San Francisco and to**
6 **enter into an agreement for the use of these funds; for the period of October 1, 2004, to**
7 **December 31, 2006.**

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9 WHEREAS, SFDPH has applied for and been awarded a grant from OTS in the
10 amount of \$319,706 to improve pedestrian safety in San Francisco by coordinating citywide
11 and targeted community-based safety campaigns; and,

12 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, OTS requires the City to enter
13 into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
14 Supervisors in File No. 041162, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if
15 set forth fully herein; and,

16 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$28,290; and,

17 WHEREAS, This Resolution requires expedited review by the Board of Supervisors
18 because we did not receive the grant award notice until July 19, 2004; and,

19 WHEREAS, Resolutions authorizing the acceptance and expenditure of grant funds
20 may be placed automatically on the consent agendas in committee, as they are usually
21 considered to be routine items, and this resolution authorizes the acceptance and expenditure
22 of grant funding; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend retroactively a
24 grant in the amount of \$319,706 from OTS; and, be it

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1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend the
2 grant funds in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Agreement pursuant to San
3 Francisco Administrative Code section 10-170-1; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the
5 agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the position funded
7 under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when the
8 agreement expires.
