

1 [Reduce sexual risk for HIV transmission in substance using men who have sex with men.]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) to**  
4 **enter retroactively into an agreement in the amount of \$130,866 with Public Health**  
5 **Foundation Enterprises Inc. (PHFE), the primary contractor, to reduce the sexual risk**  
6 **for HIV transmission in substance using men who have sex with men (SU-MSM), for the**  
7 **period of September 30, 2003, to September 29, 2004.**

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9 WHEREAS, PHFE has received funding from the Centers for Disease Control and  
10 Prevention to participate in a program to develop and conduct interventions to reduce the  
11 sexual risk for HIV transmission in SU-MSM; and,

12 WHEREAS, PHFE has requested that the SFDPH enter into a subcontract agreement  
13 to participate in this project by conducting an intervention among a diverse sample of SU-  
14 MSM to address the individual, interpersonal, and social-level factors that are most relevant to  
15 sexual risk behaviors occurring in the setting of substance use; and,

16 WHEREAS, PHFE has agreed to reimburse the SFDPH in the amount of \$130,866  
17 under the terms of this subcontract; and,

18 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds PHFE requires the SFDPH to enter  
19 into an agreement (The "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of  
20 Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_, which is hereby declared to be a part of this  
21 resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

22 WHEREAS, The subcontract budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$18,050;  
23 and,

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1           WHEREAS, This Resolution requires expedited review by the Board of Supervisors  
2 because we did not receive the subcontract from PHFE until October 29, 2003 and resolved  
3 budgetary issues on December 16, 2003; and,

4           WHEREAS, Resolutions authorizing the acceptance and expenditure of grant funds  
5 may be placed automatically on the consent agendas in committee, as they are usually  
6 considered to be routine items, and this resolution authorizes the acceptance and expenditure  
7 of grant funding; now, therefore, be it

8           RESOLVED, That the SFDPH is hereby authorized to enter retroactively into a  
9 subcontract agreement in the amount of \$130,866 with PHFE, the primary contractor; and, be  
10 it

11           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
12 Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

13           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate all positions  
14 funded under this agreement as "G" or grant-funded positions which would terminate when  
15 the agreement expires.
