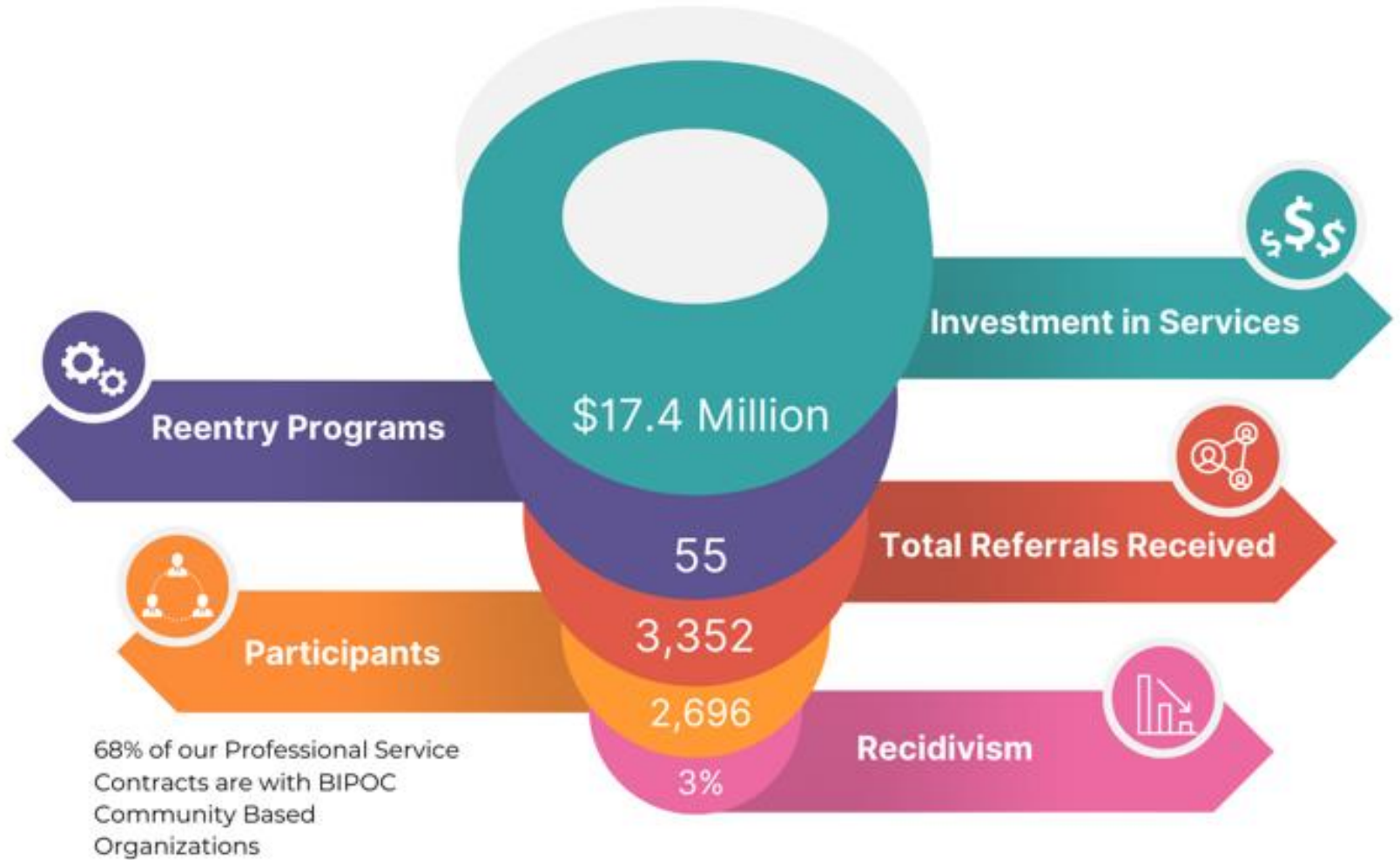

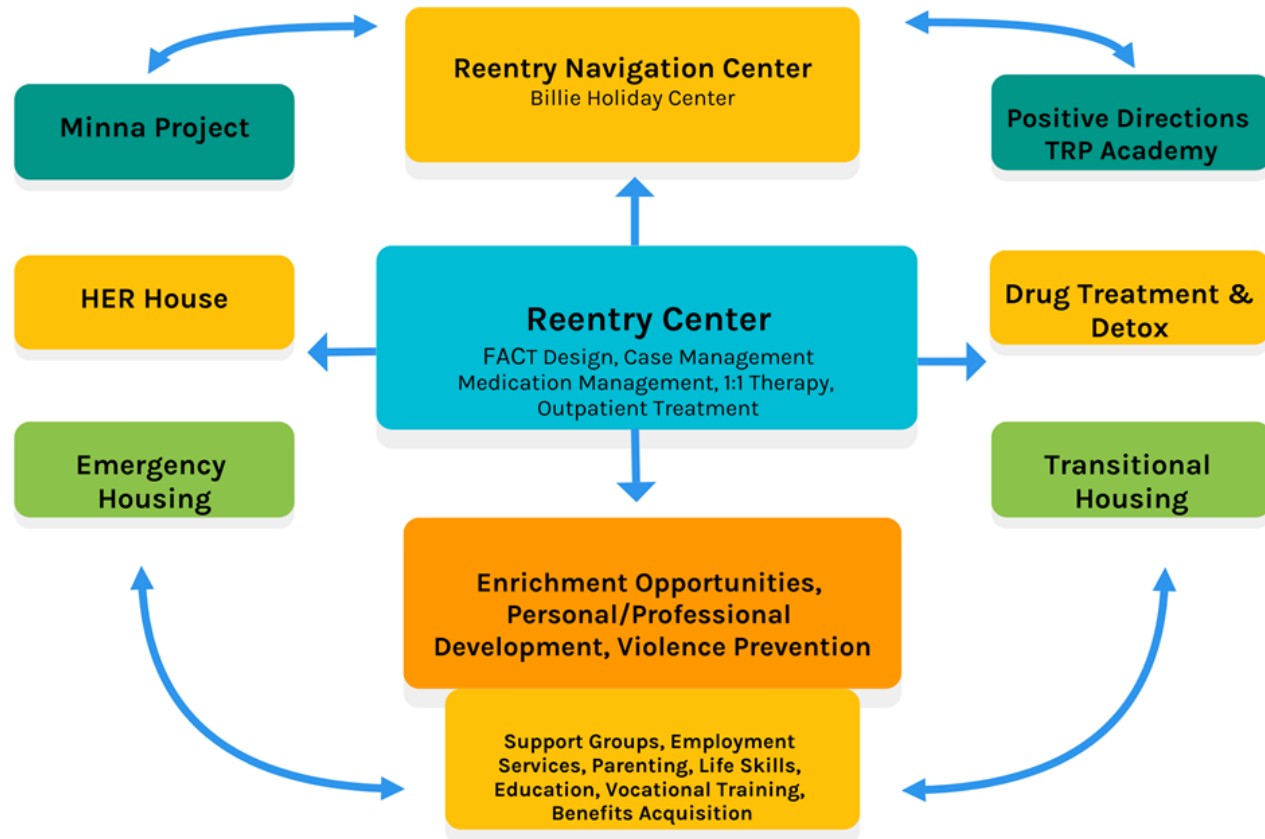

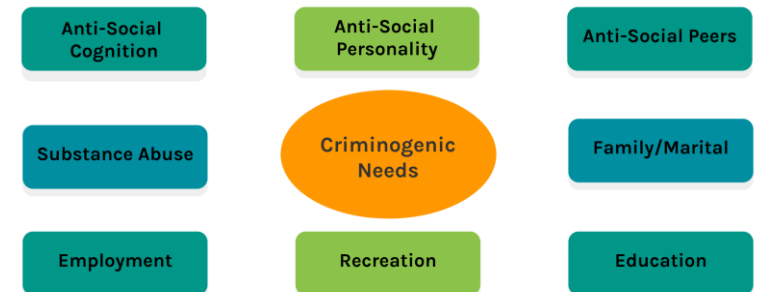

SFAPD clients engaged in the CASC's Clinical and Reentry Case Management. Our case management providers (Citywide, SEOP, M3), help clients work toward positive change



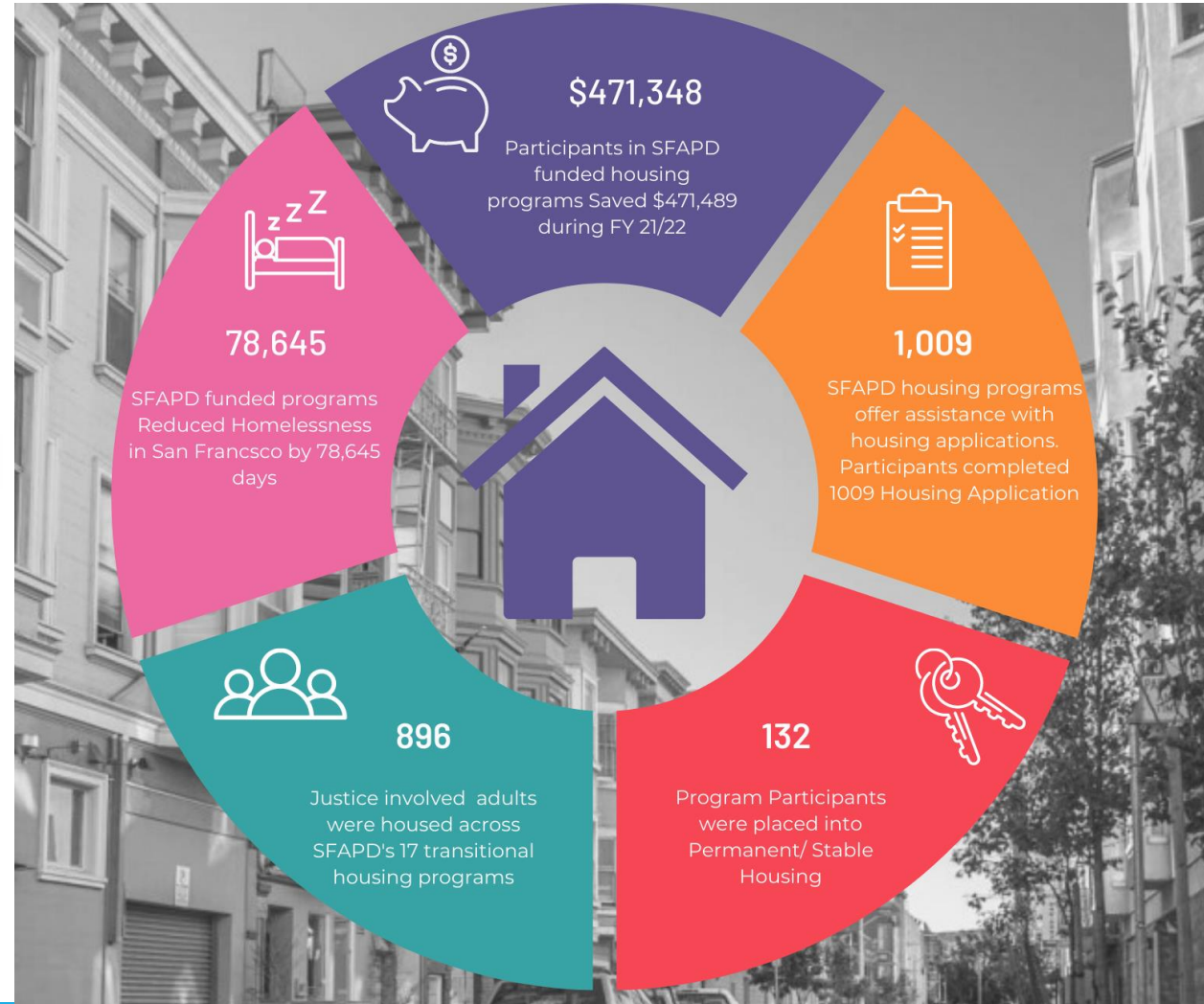

SELF-REALIZATION (NOW)

Reflect on your life:
Have drugs caused you problems with family, friends, relationships, and life goals?



4 STEP PLAN TO RECOVERY

- 1.) Make a decision to change.
- 2.) Talk to your case manager about Recovery Pathways.
- 3.) Commit. Experience progress.
- 4.) Meet goals. Feel success. You are re-gaining control of your life.



TREATMENT & SUPPORT

Treatment can be life changing:
Whether it's your first time or not, treatment can work for you.

When all other life bridges are broken, a positive support system and commitment to recovery can open doors to a life you couldn't imagine.



TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

(Up to 24 months)

Eligibility: Clients of the Adult Probation Department.

Your success matters!
As you successfully complete treatment, you will be prioritized into transitional housing.

There are TWO TREATMENT and SUPPORT pathways to success



Pathway #1

90-DAYS

Complete 90-days of a licensed residential treatment program and transfer to supportive housing.

**Men- Westside - Lower Haight
Women - Her House - Lower Haight**

- Up to one year, then transfer to New Horizons for another year
- Shared/Single Rooms
- Clean & Sober, Communal Living
- Case Management
- Life Goals & Permanent Housing Support

Pathway #2

180-DAYS

Complete 180-days of a licensed residential treatment program and transfer to New Horizons/SRO.

THC/New Horizons - Tenderloin

- Up to one year
- Single Rooms
- Clean & Sober
- Case Management
- Life Goals & Permanent Housing Support

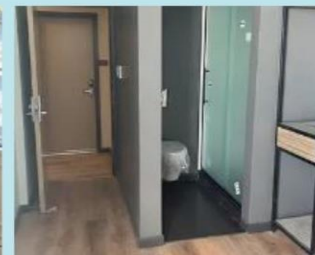
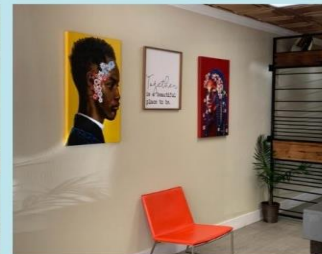
