2 DECLARING OCTOBER 7, 2000 DR. JANE GOODALL DAY IN SAN FRANCISCO IN
3 HONOR OF DR. GOODALL'S MANY INVALUABLE CONTRIBUTIONS TO CHIMPANZEE
4 RESEARCH AND PRESERVATION, THE STUDY OF EVOLUTION AND THE SUPPORT OF
5 HABITAT CONSERVATION AND PUBLIC EDUCATION THROUGH HER FOUNDING OF
6 THE JANE GOODALL INSTITUTE.

8 WHEREAS, Jane Goodall was born on April 3, 1934, in London, England and
9 exhibited a fascination with animals in early childhood when she was given a stuffed
10 chimpanzee named Jubilee on her second birthday; and

11 WHEREAS, after working as a secretary and waitress, Jane Goodall traveled to Kenya
12 at the age of 23 to visit a friend and met the paleontologist and anthropologist Dr. Louis
13 Leakey, who selected Jane Goodall to initiate a study of chimpanzees living near Lake
Tanganyika, currently Gombe National Park; and

14 WHEREAS, Jane Goodall's research at Gombe National Park, begun in July 1960, has
15 continued until the present day with the assistance and support of the Tanzanian government
16 and a Tanzanian research team, and constitutes the longest running field study of any animal
17 species within its natural environment; and

18 WHEREAS, Jane Goodall's observation of chimpanzees crafting and using tools
19 altered a long standing perception of humans as the only toolmakers among living creatures,
20 and greatly enriched the body of knowledge surrounding the evolution of humans; and

21 WHEREAS, Dr. Goodall received her Ph.D. from Cambridge University in 1965, was
22 awarded the J. Paul Getty Wildlife Conservation Prize in 1984 for her role in promoting global
23 wildlife conservation, and published twenty-five years' worth of chimpanzee-based research
24 on anthropology and conservation in 1985; and

1 WHEREAS, the Jane Goodall Institute was founded in 1977 to promote primate habitat
2 conservation, increase human awareness and education of conservation issues and support
3 non-invasive primate research; and

4 WHEREAS, Dr. Jane Goodall is currently on a "Reason for Hope Tour," running from
5 April 3, 2000 to July 16, 2001, to celebrate the 40th anniversary of her research with
6 chimpanzees in Gombe and promote the work of the Jane Goodall Institute; now, therefore,
7 be it

8 RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby commends Dr. Jane Goodall for her
9 many invaluable contributions to chimpanzee research and preservation, the study of
10 evolution and the support of habitat conservation and public education through her founding
11 of the Jane Goodall Institute, and declares Saturday, October 7, 2000, Dr. Jane Goodall Day
12 in the City of San Francisco.
