

1 [Contract With Anticipated Expenditure in Excess of \$10 Million.]

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3 **Resolution approving the Fourth Amendment to the Agreement between the City and**  
4 **County of San Francisco (Purchaser) and Sunset Scavenger Company (Contractor) for**  
5 **hauling services, resulting in total compensation to the Contractor in an amount not to**  
6 **exceed \$10,480,000, pursuant to San Francisco Charter Section 9.118(b).**

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8 WHEREAS, The Purchaser entered into an Agreement with Contractor, dated  
9 December 6, 2001, to procure hauling services of sludge, grit and other waste materials, as  
10 amended by the First Amendment dated December 12, 2003, the Second Amendment dated  
11 December 19, 2005, and the Third Amendment dated June 13, 2006 (Agreement); and,

12 WHEREAS, The Purchaser and Contractor propose to enter into a Fourth Amendment  
13 to the Agreement to extend the time for performance of the contract for a period of six (6)  
14 months, or to April 30, 2007, to continue the performance of these essential hauling services  
15 while the City pursues a competitive solicitation for a new contract for the work; and,

16 WHEREAS, The extension of time would increase the total compensation under the  
17 contract to an amount not to exceed \$10,480,000 and San Francisco Charter Section 9.118(b)  
18 provides that agreements entered into by a department, board or commission requiring  
19 anticipated expenditures by the City and County of ten million dollars, shall be subject to  
20 approval of the Board of Supervisors by resolution; and,

21 WHEREAS, The Agreement and the proposed Fourth Amendment are on file with the  
22 Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 061391, which are hereby declared to be a part  
23 of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; now, therefore, be it

24 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the Fourth Amendment to the  
25 Agreement; and, be it

1           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Purchaser and/or the Public Utilities Commission  
2 shall report back to the Board of Supervisors in 90 days regarding the status of the  
3 competitive bid process.

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
