WHEREAS, bags use increasingly scarce resources including energy, and create pollution from production through disposal, with only 1% of plastic bags being recycled; and,

WHEREAS, plastic bags create significant, persistent and costly litter problems for Bay Area streets, beaches, sewer system and the marine environment; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco and the City of Oakland have both passed landmark legislation to reduce the use of plastic bags by requiring the use of reusable, compostable plastic or recyclable paper bags, for large grocery stores; and,

WHEREAS, plastic bags are perceived as disposable products and are an impediment to landfill diversion and waste reduction; and,

WHEREAS, a plastics industry front group calling itself "The Coalition to Support Plastic Bag Recycling" is suing the City of Oakland in an effort to overturn the city's ordinance on the grounds that the city did not comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA); and,

WHEREAS, completion of an unnecessary Environmental Impact Assessment could set a precedent that would interfere with other local government attempts to protect the environment and public health; now, therefore, be it
