Tenant Right to Counsel has been a largely successful program, helping most tenants who receive full scope representation to stay housed. The housing crisis leads to homelessness, which leads to ruined lives and death. Just this Sunday, folks at PoorMagazine held a homegoing memorial for elders Bruce and Julio, who passed away on the streets of SF. This is a part of the solution to prevent needless and deadly evictions in a cost-effective manner.
