19	Section 1. Findings.				
20	(a) The Office of the District Attorney was awarded \$2,050,000 by the State of				
21	California Board of State and Community Corrections to support the Organized Retail Theft				
22	Vertical Prosecution Grant Program.				
23	(b) The grant agreement service period is from October 1, 2023, to December 31,				
24	2026. The period of January 1, 2027, to June 1, 2027, is included in the term of the grant				
25	agreement for the completion of Final Local Evaluation Report and financial audit only.				

1	(c) The Organized Retail Theft Vertical Prosecution Grant Program was established in
2	the State Budget Act of 2022 (Assembly Bill 178, Chapter 45, Statutes of 2022).
3	
4	Section 2. Authorization to accept and expend grant funds.
5	(a) The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Office of the District Attorney to
6	accept and expend, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, State of California
7	Board of State and Community Corrections grant funds in the amount of \$2,050,000 to
8	support the Organized Retail Theft Vertical Prosecution Grant Program to address the
9	increased levels of retail theft property crimes by using a vertical prosecution model.
10	(b) The District Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco is authorized,
11	on behalf of the Board of Supervisors, to submit the attached proposal to the California Board
12	of State and Community Corrections and is authorized to execute the Grant Agreement,
13	included in Board of Supervisors File No. 231222, and to execute any amendments thereof.
14	(c) The grant funds received thereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures
15	controlled by this body.
16	(d) The Office of the District Attorney agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of
17	the Grant Agreement as set forth by the State of California Board of State and Community
18	Corrections.
19	(e) The Office of the District Attorney is required to complete a Local Evaluation Plan
20	that will be used to evaluate the effectiveness of the project component(s), with the project
21	goals and the project objectives clearly stated. The Local Evaluation Plan is due no later than
22	April 1, 2024.
23	(f) The Office of the District Attorney is required to submit a Local Evaluation Report
24	

1	to determine whether the overall project (including each individual component) was effective		
2	in meeting the goals laid out in the Local Evaluation Plan. The Local Evaluation Report is due		
3	no later than June 1, 2027.		
4	(g) A financial audit is required to cover the service delivery period of the grant		
5	(October 1, 2023 - December 31, 2026). The audit report will be due no later than June 1,		
6	2027. The financial audit shall be performed by a Certified Public Accountant or a participating		
7	county or city auditor that is organizationally independent from the participating county or		
8	city's project financial management functions.		
9	(h) The total personnel budget for the two (2) new positions (2.0 FTE) and one (1)		
10	current part-time position (0.25 FTE) is \$1,782,147 of the total grant award of \$2,050,000 for		
11	the term October 1, 2023, to June 1, 2027. The balance of the grant award is allocated to pay		
12	\$150,000 for data collection and evaluation contract, \$10,000 for audit expense, \$39,177 for		
13	facility rental, \$11,048 for travel/training, and \$57,628 for indirect costs.		
14			
15	Section 3. Grant funded positions: Amendment to Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and Fiscal		
16	Year 2024-2025 Annual Salary Ordinance.		
17	The hereinafter designated sections and items of Ordinance No. 145-23 (Annual Salary
