## **Comprehensive prevention system in partnership with HSH:**

- Homelessness Prevention at HSH
- Eviction Prevention & Housing Stabilization at MOHCD
  - Tenant Right to Counsel
  - Tenant Counseling, Education & Outreach
  - Tenant-Landlord Mediation
  - Emergency Rental Assistance & Subsidies
  - Housing Retention in City-Subsidized Housing

# Funding Plan FY21-22



## Eviction Prevention & Housing Stabilization

- \$21.5M to augment existing partnerships
  - Beginning in December 2021
  - Workforce linkages will be a key program element
  - Includes \$10M of Prop. C rental assistance and \$10.5M of other eviction prevention/housing stabilization
- \$9M in new programming
  - RFP in early 2022
  - Includes \$4.5M of Prop. C eviction prevention/housing stabilization
