17 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

19 Section 1. Chapter 57 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising  
20 Sections 57.1, 57.2, 57.3, 57.4, 57.5, and 57.8, to read as follows:

21 **SEC. 57.1 DEFINITIONS.**

22 For purposes of this Chapter 57, the following terms shall have the following  
23 meanings:

25 "Film" means feature motion pictures, video tapes, television programs, commercials, still  
photography, documentaries, travelogues, music videos, web videos, web series, and other  
visual art forms; provided however, that "film" shall not mean films or video tapes for private-

1 family use or films by any news service or similar entity engaged in on-the-spot print media,  
2 publishing, or broadcasting, of breaking news events and on-going coverage of such events as  
3 they occur.

6 **SEC. 57.2. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION; APPOINTMENT OF**  
7 **COMMISSIONERS; QUALIFICATIONS; TERMS OF OFFICE; COMPENSATION.**

8 \* \* \* \*

9 (f) **Executive Director.** ~~The Commission shall appoint an Executive Director of the~~  
10 ~~Commission who shall serve at the Commission's pleasure.~~ The Executive Director shall act as the  
11 department head and appointing officer of ~~the~~ Commission employees pursuant to Charter  
12 Section 4.126. The Executive Director shall supervise the Commission's staff, and shall have  
13 other duties and responsibilities as provided in this Chapter. The Mayor shall appoint the  
14 Executive Director as provided in Charter Sections 3.100(19) and 4.102(5). The Commission may  
15 remove the Executive Director as provided in Charter Section 4.102(6).

16  
17 **SEC. 57.3 POWERS AND DUTIES**

18 The Commission shall develop, recognize, and promote film activities in the City. The  
19 members shall work together to explore and promote long-term goals for film-making as a  
20 major emphasis of the City's economic and cultural base, and encourage the recognition of  
21 film arts as an art form with widespread economic components. The powers of the  
22 Commission shall include, but not be limited to:

24 (e) Accepting gifts, devises and bequests as provided in Administrative Code Sections ~~10-~~  
25 ~~116 through 10.116-3~~10.100-305;

3                   **SEC. 57.4. AUTHORITY AND DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.**

4                   In addition to any other authority vested in or duty charged to ~~him or her~~the Executive Director,  
5                   the Executive Director shall serve as the sole liaison between film companies and the various  
6                   City departments. In performing the duties of liaison, the Executive Director shall assist film  
7                   companies in locating suitable locations and shall coordinate the efforts of the various City  
8                   departments in connection with film production utilizing City property or employees. The  
9                   Executive Director shall also be responsible for coordinating any film permits required by the  
10                  City for film productions. The Executive Director may approve the use of the Film SF logo by third  
11                  parties for marketing and promotion of Film Commission programs and activities.

12  
13                  **SEC. 57.5. AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO USE CONTRACTS AND**  
14                  **COORDINATE CITY DEPARTMENTS REGARDING FILM COMPANIES; CONSENT OF**  
15                  **RELEVANT DEPARTMENTS; COST RECOVERY; SIDEWALK CLOSURE AND POSTING.**

16                   \* \* \* \*

17                  (c) **Schedule of Costs.** In addition to the reimbursement of City departments for the  
18                  costs incurred by those departments in deploying personnel or equipment, the Film  
19                  Commission may, consistent with Charter Section 2.109, charge daily use fees to film  
20                  companies seeking to engage in film production. The use fees are as follows:

21                               (1) Still photography: ~~\$1~~200 a day.

22                               (2) A commercial, corporate media, industrial media, video, or web  
23                               video: ~~\$2~~300 a day.

24                               (3) A television series (each episode), web series (each episode),  
25                               movie, pilot, short subject, or documentary:

1 (A) For a production with a budget of less than \$100,000: ~~\$5~~100 a day.

2 (B) For a production with a budget of \$100,000 to less than \$500,000: ~~\$1~~300 a  
3 day.

4 (C) For a production with a budget of \$500,000 or greater: ~~\$3~~500 a day.

5 Public service announcements, qualifying student productions, and productions  
6 created by or for entities that are tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue  
7 Code are exempt from the above-listed use fees. The revenue generated by such use fees  
8 shall be deposited in the San Francisco Film Production Fund.

11 **SEC. 57.8. FILM REBATE PROGRAM.**

12 \* \* \* \*

13 (c) **Rebate Program.**

14 (1) **Allowance of Rebate.** A qualified low-budget film production or qualified film  
15 production that pays qualified production costs shall be entitled to a rebate, to be calculated  
16 as provided herein, provided that the qualified production has entered into a first source hiring  
17 agreement with the City that demonstrates good faith efforts to hire economically  
18 disadvantaged individuals referred by the San Francisco Workforce Development System to  
19 work for the qualified production. Good faith efforts shall include, at a minimum, consulting  
20 with the First Source Hiring Administration ("FSHA") for the purpose of preparing a list of  
21 positions for which individuals referred by the City might qualify, providing that list to the  
22 FSHA at least two weeks prior to the first day of shooting, and documenting efforts to contact  
23 and interview job candidates referred by the City to fill the positions listed.

24 (2) **Amount of Rebate.** *As of* July 1, 2015, the City shall pay one dollar for each  
25 dollar the qualified low budget film production or qualified film production paid in qualified

1 production costs not to exceed \$13,000,000 by June 30, 2028, provided that such rebate  
2 payment shall not exceed \$600,000 for each such production. No television series or web  
3 series shall qualify for more than \$600,000 in rebate payments per season. The rebates shall  
4 be paid from the project account that the Controller has set aside for Film Rebate Program  
5 funds (the "Film Rebate Project Account"). The rebates shall not be paid from funds dedicated  
6 under bond or other legal financing covenants. Rebates paid under this Section 57.8 shall be  
7 paid only to those qualified low budget film productions or qualified film productions whose  
8 filming commenced on or after May 20, 2006. The reasonable expenses of the Film Commission in  
9 connection with administering the Rebate Program and reasonable marketing expenses to promote the  
10 Rebate Program may be paid out of the Film Rebate Project Account.

11 \* \* \* \*

12 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment.  
13 Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance  
14 unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of  
15 Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

16  
17 Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends  
18 to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers,  
19 punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code  
20 that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment  
21 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under  
22 the official title of the ordinance.

## LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Film Commission Programs]

**Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to clarify when the filming of a news event does not require a use contract; to clarify that the Executive Director is appointed pursuant to Charter, Sections 3.100(19) and 4.102(5); to authorize the Executive Director to approve the use of the Film SF logo by third parties to market Film Commission programs and activities; to increase the daily use fees to engage in film production; and to allow funds from the Film Rebate Project Account to be used to administer and market the Film Rebate Program.**

### Existing Law

Existing law provides that a film company that wishes to film a news event is not required to obtain a film use contract from the Film Commission.

Existing law does not specifically authorize the Executive Director to approve third-party use of the Film SF logo for marketing and promotion of Film Commission programs and activities.

Under existing law, the daily use fees for film companies seeking to engage in film production are as follows:

- (1) Still photography: \$100 a day.
- (2) A commercial, corporate media, industrial media, video, or web video: \$200 a day.
- (3) A television series (each episode), web series (each episode), 1 movie, pilot, short subject, or documentary:
  - (A) For a production with a budget of less than \$100,000: \$50 a day.
  - (B) For a production with a budget of \$100,000 to less than \$500,000: \$100 a day.
  - (C) For a production with a budget of \$500,000 or greater: \$300 a day.

Existing law does not authorize the use of funds in the Film Rebate Project Account for the Film Commission's reasonable expenses to administer the Film Rebate Program or for marketing the Program.

### Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would clarify the exception from the film use contract requirement for news events. This exception applies to breaking news events and ongoing coverage of such events as they occur. The exception does not apply to



documentaries or other filming that may occur after coverage of the breaking news event has concluded.

The proposed ordinance would correct the code to reflect the Charter-mandated process governing the appointment and removal of the Executive Director. The Mayor appoints the Executive Director from a list of candidates provided by the Film Commission under Charter Sections 3.100(19) and 4.102(5). The Film Commission may remove the Executive Director on its own initiative or upon the Mayor's recommendation under Charter Section 4.102(6).

The amendments to the existing law would specifically allow the Executive Director to approve the third-party use of the Film SF logo for marketing and promotion of Film Commission programs and activities.

Under the proposed amendments, the daily use fees for film companies seeking to engage in film production would increase as follows:

- (1) Still photography: \$200 a day.
- (2) A commercial, corporate media, industrial media, video, or web video: \$300 a day.
- (3) A television series (each episode), web series (each episode), 1 movie, pilot, short subject, or documentary:
  - (A) For a production with a budget of less than \$100,000: \$100 a day.
  - (B) For a production with a budget of \$100,000 to less than \$500,000: \$300 a day.
  - (C) For a production with a budget of \$500,000 or greater: \$500 a day.

The amendments would authorize funds from the Film Rebate Project Account to be used for the Film Commission's reasonable expenses to administer the Film Rebate Program and for marketing and promotion of the Program.

Production of a television series (each episode), web series (each episode), movie, pilot, short subject, or documentary with a budget of less than \$100,000 will increase from \$50 to \$100 a day; with a budget of \$100,000 to less than


\$500,000 will increase from \$100 to \$300 a day; and with a budget of \$500,000 or greater will increase from \$300 to \$500 a day.

Ordinance amending the Business and Tax Regulations Code to update emergency medical services fees to reflect amounts authorized under annual adjustment provisions and to require fees for certain additional services; and amending the Health Code to define the terms "trauma center" and "pediatric center." If this legislation passes, amendments to the fees in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 249.8, will reflect intervening administrative adjustments and show the actual amounts currently authorized and charged, payable to the Department of Emergency Management. The initial application fee for every

person, firm, or corporation engaged in operating a private ambulance that requires a Certificate of Operation increases from \$12,800 to \$13,517 and the annual renewal fee increases from \$6,400 to \$6,758. The annual ambulance permit fee for every person, firm, or corporation holding a Certificate of Operation increases from \$2,048 to \$2,163. The Initial Application fees for an EMS Training Program increases from \$2,272 to \$2,399 for a Paramedic Program; increases from \$1,517 to \$1,602 for an Emergency Medical Technician ("EMT") Program, and increases from \$762 to \$805 for a Continuing Education Program. EMS Training Program Renewal will increase from \$1,139 to \$1,203 for a Paramedic Program; from \$832 to \$879 for an EMT Program; and increase from \$461 to \$487 for a Continuing Education Program. Applying for an initial EMT Certificate will increase from \$183 to \$193; renewal of current and valid EMT Certificate, not including EMT-Paramedic, will increase from \$135 to \$143 due every two years; and application for initial and lapsed EMT Paramedic Accreditation will increase from \$40 to \$42. A new \$42 fee is established for applications for initial and lapsed Critical Care Paramedic Endorsement and Community Paramedic Accreditation. A new \$25 fee is established for lost/duplicate EMT Certificate, Accreditation or Endorsement Cards and Professional Verification Form Completion. Fees that are due and payable annually in advance to the Department of Emergency Management by the following facilities that receive patients through Ambulance Service Providers will increase from \$19,523 to \$20,616 for Receiving Hospitals; STEMI Centers will increase from \$23,861 to \$25,197; Stroke Centers will increase from \$23,861 to \$25,197; and establishes a new fee of \$25,197 for Trauma and Pediatric Centers. Plan review fees are established for special events permitted by City Departments, based on anticipated crowd size, are due and payable upon submission of an event medical plan; \$1,000 with 10,000 persons or more; \$500 with 5,000 to 9,999 persons; \$150 with 1,000 to 4,999; and \$50 with 1 to 999 persons. An initial application fee is established for every person, firm, or corporation engaged as a Community Paramedic Provider of \$200,000 at the time of filing the initial application or program review under Community Paramedic or Triage to Alternate Destination Code of 2020, and an annual renewal fee of \$100,000 to the Department of Emergency Management.
