4	Francisco; acknowledging that the San Francisco Department of Public Works is an
5	integral part of the community and has produced significant achievements;
6	encouraging all San Francisco residents and businesses to work in collaboration with
7	the department.

9	WHEREAS, Public works programs and services provided in the City and County of
10	San Francisco are delivered by a professional and committed staff of public works employees
11	and
12	WHEREAS, It is the mission of the San Francisco Department of Public Works to
13	improve the quality of life in San Francisco through partnering with the community and
14	providing outstanding public service; and where its programs and services, provided twenty-
15	four hours a day, seven days per week, are an integral part of our residents' everyday lives;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, During the last year, the San Francisco Department of Public Works has
18	produced significant achievements, including the opening of the award-winning California
19	Academy of Sciences, for which DPW provided project management services; and the
20	accomplishment of Mayor Newsom's Trees For Tomorrow challenge with the planting of more
21	than 25,000 trees; and
22	WHEREAS, Public works is dedicated to community outreach and has provided
23	thousands of volunteers with meaningful neighborhood improvement work in the past year;

WHEREAS, An important feature of National Public Works Week is the recognition that public-private partnerships between the city and its residents, businesses and visitors, are vital to the success of public works projects; and

WHEREAS, The theme of 2009 National Public Works Week is Revitalize, Reinvest, and Renew, a theme embraced by DPW during the annual weeklong events honoring the women and men who make daily contributions in public works-related efforts, including designing, operating and improving the city's infrastructure; graffiti removal, tree planting and maintenance; neighborhood beautification and volunteer clean-ups; street and sewer repair; architecture and engineering services; and street use and mapping services; collectively known as public works, and now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby declares May 17th through May 23rd, 2009, as Public Works Week in San Francisco and commends the men and women of the Department of Public Works while calling upon all of its residents, businesses, and neighborhood and merchant organizations to work in collaboration with the department as it enhances the quality of life in San Francisco.
