[Public Works Code - Banner Fee Waiver]

Ordinance amending the Public Works Code to waive banner and inspection fees for certain nonprofit organizations in all Neighborhood Commercial Districts (NCDs), Neighborhood Commercial Transit Districts (NCTDs), and Residential Transit Oriented, Commercial (RTO-C) Districts; and affirming the Planning Department’s determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 260683 and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this determination.

Section 2. Article 5.7 of the Public Works Code is hereby amended by revising Section 184.78, to read as follows:

SEC. 184.78. BANNERS.

* * * *

(h) No banners may be installed in R (residential) districts, excepting RM-4 (residential-mixed high density) and RTO-C (Residential Transit Oriented, Commercial) districts as defined in the San Francisco Planning Code, Article 2 and excepting the R (residential) districts contained within the area defined as the North of Market/Tenderloin Community Benefit District in Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 584-05, Clerk of the Board of Supervisors File No. 051192, including the street face opposite the boundaries of this District.

* * * *

(r) **Fee Exemptions for Certain Nonprofit Organizations in ~~Certain~~ Neighborhood Commercial Districts, ~~and~~ Neighborhood Commercial Transit Districts, and Residential Transit Oriented, Commercial Districts.**

(1) **Exempt Nonprofit Organization.** For purposes of this subsection 184.78(r), "Exempt Nonprofit Organization" shall mean any organization that (A) is exempt from income taxation under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; (B) has an annual budget of no more than \$2500,000; and (C) is located in a Neighborhood Commercial, ~~District or~~ Neighborhood Commercial Transit, or Residential Transit Oriented, Commercial District ~~specified in subsection (r)(3) or primarily serves one or more of these districts specified in subsection (r)(3).~~

(2) An Exempt Nonprofit Organization shall be exempt from banner permit fees and inspection fees set forth in Section 184.78 with respect to the Exempt Nonprofit Organization's installation of banners sharing the same content and design on City-owned utility poles within the geographic boundaries of the Neighborhood Commercial, ~~or~~ Neighborhood Commercial Transit, or Residential Transit Oriented, Commercial District(s) that the Exempt Nonprofit Organization primarily serves, or in which the Exempt Nonprofit Organization is located. At the time of application for any banner permit, the Exempt Nonprofit Organization shall submit its budget for the current calendar or fiscal year, a copy of its most

1 recent federal tax return or Internal Revenue Service Form 990, if required to file such return,
2 and except to the extent that such return is privileged, and any other information that the
3 Department of Public Works determines is necessary to verify the Exempt Nonprofit
4 Organization's eligibility for the fee waivers contained in this subsection 184.78(r). The
5 Exempt Nonprofit Organization may modify the content or design of the banners installed in
6 conformance with this subsection (r) and remove and replace such banners without incurring
7 banner permit fees and inspection fees for up to two times per year per banner permit. The
8 Exempt Nonprofit Organization shall be required to pay the banner permit fees and inspection
9 fees for the removal and replacement of each banner more than two times per year. All other
10 provisions of ~~Public Works Code~~ this Section 184.78, including the investigation fees set forth in
11 subsection (n), shall remain in full effect and shall apply to these banners.

20 Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
21 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
22 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
23 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
24 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
25 the official title of the ordinance.

2 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after
3 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
4 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
5 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Public Works Code - Banner Fee Waiver]

Ordinance amending the Public Works Code to waive banner and inspection fees for certain nonprofit organizations in all Neighborhood Commercial Districts (NCDs), Neighborhood Commercial Transit Districts (NCTDs), and Residential Transit Oriented, Commercial (RTO-C) Districts; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

Public Works Code Section 184.78 specifies a process and conditions under which banners may be placed on City-owned utility poles. Applicants for banner permits must pay permit and inspection fees. The Board of Supervisors has approved various waivers of these banner permit and inspection fees under the Public Works Code, including for nonprofit organizations with an annual budget of no more than \$250,000 that are located in or primarily serve certain Neighborhood Commercial Districts and Neighborhood Commercial Transit Districts.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would expand the existing banner fee waiver to include nonprofit organizations with an annual budget of no more than \$500,000 that are located in or primarily serve all Neighborhood Commercial Districts, Neighborhood Commercial Transit Districts, and Residential Transit-Oriented, Commercial (RTO-C) Districts.
