

1 [Contract - Sheriff's Department - Secure Reentry Program Facility - \$4,195,576]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the Sheriff's Department to enter into a contract with the**
4 **California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to contract for, accept**
5 **and expend up to \$4,195,576 to establish the Secure Reentry Program Facility (SRPF);**
6 **the Sheriff's Department will provide housing appropriate for program delivery; the**
7 **Adult Probation Department will provide intensive, in-custody evidence-based reentry**
8 **programming, which will address offenders' underlying criminogenic needs; the**
9 **Sheriff's Department and Adult Probation Department shall jointly report to the State**
10 **Legislature and the CDCR on the implementation of this SRPF after a period of one,**
11 **two, and three years as part of this pilot program, to commence upon Board approval**
12 **for a three-year term.**

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14 WHEREAS, Governor Edmund Brown signed into law AB109, the Public Safety
15 Realignment Act of 2011, and AB 17, a clean-up trailer bill that made technical and
16 conforming revisions consistent with and within the framework of AB 109; and

17 WHEREAS, AB 17 amended the Penal Code to authorize a board of supervisors, upon
18 agreement with the Sheriff, to enter into a contract with the California Department of
19 Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to house inmates who are within 60 days or less of
20 release from the state prison to a county jail facility for the purpose of reentry and community
21 transition purposes; and

22 WHEREAS, The provision of pre-release planning and rehabilitative services
23 substantially improves public safety outcomes; and

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1 WHEREAS, The Sheriff and the Adult Probation Department are committed to a
2 collaborative approach to the problem of recidivism by combining the expertise of local
3 government, law enforcement, and community-based organizations in order to provide a
4 seamless transition for individuals being released from jail and prison; and

5 WHEREAS, CDCR seeks to enter into a contract with San Francisco County for the
6 purpose of developing a collaborative approach designed to reduce recidivism among San
7 Francisco's offender population and enhance public safety; and

8 WHEREAS, The Governor's Budget Act of 2013 provides that The Department of
9 Corrections and Rehabilitation may utilize up to \$5,000,000 to enter into contracts for three-
10 year Reentry and Community Transition pilot programs with the counties of Los Angeles,
11 Marin, San Diego, and San Francisco, pursuant to Section 4115.56 of the Penal Code; and

12 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco's Sheriff's Department is the
13 agency charged with the care and confinement of arrested and sentenced persons for the City
14 and County of San Francisco; and

15 WHEREAS, San Francisco Charter Section 9.118 (a) provides that contracts entered
16 into by a department having anticipated revenue to the City and County of one million dollars
17 or more shall be subject to approval of the Board of Supervisors by resolution; now, therefore,
18 be it

19 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the San Francisco County
20 Sheriff, or his designee, to enter into the contract with CDCR on file with the Clerk of the
21 Board in File No. 131229; and be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the contract being full executed
23 by all parties, the San Francisco Sheriff shall provide the contract to the Clerk of the Board for
24 inclusion into the official file; and be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Sheriff to enter
2 into any amendments or modifications of the contract that the Sheriff determines, in
3 consultation with the City Attorney, are in the best interest of the City, do not materially
4 increase the obligations or liabilities of the City, do not materially decrease the City's rights
5 under the contract, are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of the contract or
6 this resolution, and are in compliance with all applicable laws, including the City Charter.
