STANLEY GOFF, J.D., M.A., B.A., A.A. (Attorney, Motivational Speaker, Reentry Consultant, Author)

Stanley Goff is a former inmate who was in and out of juvenile facilities and county jails, a former fugitive on the run for two years, who ultimately wound up serving a total of eight years in California state prisons for selling cocaine which stemmed from me serving two prison terms (One term from 1993 to 1995) and the (other term from 1996 to 2001). However, while he was incarcerated in 1996, and waiting for his 2001 release date, a change took place in his life. He decided that he no longer wanted to serve "life" on the installment plan and that he wanted to be a positive example for his then three-year old son. He started to take steps to self-educate himself while he was locked up. He read hundreds of social and politically conscious books in order to increase his vocabulary, reading comprehension and general understanding of political and social issues in the United States and around the world. He also worked on his own criminal appeal and provided legal help to other prisoners, which sparked an interest inside him to study law. It was during this time period that he decided that he wanted to go to law school and become an attorney. However, this objective was going to be a difficult one, because the highest level of education that he had at that "me was a G.E.D. with an extensive criminal history.

Upon his release from prison in December of 2001, He decided to enroll in college to increase hi chance at successful reentry, be an example to others facing the same challenges and to pursue his goal of becoming an attorney.

He obtained an A.A. degree in Paralegal Studies from City College of San Francisco in 2004, a B.A. degree in Political Science from San Francisco State University in 2005 and an M.A. degree in Political Science from San Francisco State University in 2007. He then went on to obtain a Juris Doctorate degree from John F. Kennedy University in 2009. He passed the Feb 2013 California Bar Exam and he is now a practicing attorney. Stanley Goff is also a Motivational Speaker addressing reentry related issues such as the importance of post secondary education to those who are incarcerated, have been incarcerated or who are at risk of incarceration and he is the author of "Punishment Beyond the Crime" "The Non-Democratic Treatment of Ex-Felons in the United States." Stanley Goff has lectured to at-risk youth in San Francisco about the importance of staying away from crime, as well as given motivational speeches to parolees at Parole Orientation Meetings.

Since our first meeting up to the present, I have experienced Joe's determination to live a productive life of personal growth and service to the community as unwavering. He has always exemplified the most important qualities it takes to manage life after incarceration; gratitude, humility, perseverance, courage and discipline.

Joe was willing to put himself on a public stage, within the first year of his release, for a CCWP fundraising event that focused on juveniles tried as adults. I was so impressed that he was able to face the understandable anxiety of telling his own story of being a very young person sentenced to a long prison stretch — on stage to a crowd of folks — because he truly understood the vital impact his experience carries in educating the public and prevent other young people from experiencing the same trauma.

To Whom It May Concern:

It is with the utmost pleasure and enthusiasm that I am writing this letter in support of Mr. Joseph Calderon. I have known Mr. Calderon for over twenty years, as we grew up together in the Mission District. We shared similar paths as youth that included multiple run-ins with authority typical of what you would call "at-risk youth." Our paths diverged when, like so many young men of our generation, Mr. Calderon caught a felony case. Despite this, I can say that even back then he was always an intelligent, thoughtful person, with innate leadership qualities, that looked out for those of us that were younger than him. I found my way to higher education through sport and Mr. Calderon never reproached me for it, but instead encouraged that successful change.

Since his release we have reconnected and I have been impressed with all that he has managed to accomplish after his incarceration. However, his accomplishments began even before his release. He didn't waste his time in prison, but rather used it to reflect on the path he wanted for himself and his family. Most importantly, he did everything right to start down the path toward redemption. Everything that I have seen and heard from him since then has been in that direction. It's as if he is on a quest to make up for lost time with good deeds not just for his family and friends, but for society in general. We've talked at length about how while still incarcerated he began studying, as well as how he earned certificates for working on engines and electronics. He then went on to facilitate reentry groups that helped men get ready to adjust to life outside of prison. Those experiences have served him well, as he has been a model citizen since his release.

Since coming home, he's stayed out of trouble not because of luck or fate, but because of wise decisions made by an intelligent and mature man. He's grounded in a loving and supportive family, wife and children, he has a steady job and good friends. Additionally, he's poised to earn his Associates degree in liberal arts with an emphasis on social and behavioral science from City-College of San Francisco. We've talked about his desire to transfer to a four-year university once he's done and I have no doubt that he will accomplish that goal. More impressively, I have been inspired by his work both volunteer and professional with incarcerated and "at risk" young men at the Omega Boys Club and Mo Magic respectively. I believe that he is truly making a difference in some of these young people's lives and they are lucky to have such a mentor. In fact, I've been so impressed that I have invited him to come speak to my students at the University of California, Santa Cruz because I think it will inspire them as well. Lastly, as a sign of his commitment to civic engagement, Mr. Calderon has begun seeking a position with the San Francisco Reentry Council—something that I not only applaud, but wholeheartedly support!

After a surprising and disappointing experience at my first P.A.C.T meeting my transition back to San Francisco continues to be smooth and meaningful. What has help me to make my transition back into the community is personal determination, and several ancillary factors. I left prison with a plan for my transition that included Walden House, and I did not attach any form of time line to my plan. I was able to voice my reentry concerns to the P.A.C.T. organizer which led to making a personal presentation before the reentry council, and gaining even greater focus and determination to see my plan through to fruition. I also had the guidance of a lifer that had made a successful transition back to San Francisco, and he not only talked the talk but walked the walk. Other than a couple of minor bureaucratic glitches I have not ran into any barriers in my transition back to San Francisco.

6. How can we help other people transition from prisons and jails more successfully? How can we help people permanently exit the criminal justice system?

We need to become pro-active and reach out to the prospective client before he/she exits prison/jail. We need to start providing support and resource information before their release so when they are released they have a viable plan in place that is conducive to making a successful transition back into their community. This could equate to exiting the criminal justice system, and a lower recidivist rate. We go to prison/jail because of our inability to make the right choices an/or decisions in our lives, and even with longevity, education, and insight, vestiges of this inability will exit prison/jail with an unacceptable number of us. We exit prison/jail with issues that have us unwilling to deal with "the system" or anyone in a suit. But will more often than not listen to our peers, especially if it is felt that the individual has "been there-done that", has integrity, and has him/herself made a a successful reentry back into the community. We need to involve some of these successful individuals in the reentry process to support and guild those individuals exiting prison/jail. They should be given a probationary stipend, and when they complete their probation successful they should become a salaried part of the reentry process. Reentry should not be looked at as an event. It is not an event, it is a PROCESS, and can be a lengthy one for most.

7. What do you hope that the Reentry Council will achieve?

It would take dedication, planning, hard work, and funding. But I would like to see The Reentry Council Of San Francisco be the first to implement a pro-active and innovative pilot program. It would be designed to effectively address the resource needs of persons exiting prison/jail to reside in San Francisco. A successful transition to San Francisco can be an exit out of the criminal justice system and can lower the recidivism rate.

Earnest completed many classes that include DBT, Anger Management, Criminal Addictive Behaviors, Relapse Prevention, Seeking Safety and work several job functions that included, Ramrod of the Kitchen, Chairman of CORE, and eventually became a housing manager at our Treasure Island Facility on Chinook Court. Earnest also was a house driver and continues to come back to the facility to assist new clients and support the community on his free time. Earnest has become a role model in the community and assist staff in working with orientation clients. Earnest has come full circle from being incarcerated to being in treatment and working with staff as a house manager and now coming back to the community to give back and show others that change can happen and that if they work hard enough that they can make a difference in society.

HealthRIGHT360 is a non-profit organization devoted to helping chemical dependent persons come to terms with and overcome their substance abuse problems. For over 40 years, healthRIGHT360 has helped chemically dependent individuals with the tools that are necessary to become responsible members of the community. 

Mr. Kirkwood participated in a 40 hour restorative justice oriented program in which I served as the Lead Facilitator.

In the short time I have known Mr. Kirkwood, it is obvious that he cares deeply for the well-being and successful reentry of formerly incarcerated men and women. 

I am writing to strongly recommend David Cowan for appointment to the Reentry Council of San Francisco. He has deep personal and professional experience in this field and a strong creative and organizational skill set that will enormously benefit the Reentry Council.

I have enjoyed working with David in a variety of professional circles, most notably:

- 1) Providing much needed professional support for the educational and rehabilitative programs at San Quentin State Prison.
- 2) Developing reintegration services for the Alliance for Change a non-profit he co-founded in 2009.

While I was a fulltime volunteer with the Office of Community Partnerships at San Quentin, David was the primary support available for scheduling and logistics needs for the rehabilitative and educational programs at the prison. In addition to his regular job supporting the college program at San Quentin, David maintained and regularly improved the databases that coordinated over 100 secular programs, and freely offered assistance to maintain and update the religious program databases, as well. More importantly, he was known universally as a skilled, efficient and friendly resource who would bend over backward to make sure the programs continued to run and attendees had access to their classes every day. Upon his departure, his formal and informal duties were divided up among 2 full-time and 3 part-time clerks – a testament to the amount of work David was able to manage so well.

Little did I know at the time how deeply his involvement in rehabilitative programs at the prison ran. As I'm sure David can tell you himself, he thought strategically and critically about how to best serve the population inside San Quentin, particularly in preparation for and beyond each man's release. Dissatisfied with the effectiveness of existing classes and interventions, David and a few close friends, in collaboration a group of volunteers from local universities, designed their own curriculum and formed a cross-walled community of positive-minded men and women dedicated to

being a force of growth and renewal in the communities in which they live and to which they would return. This community became the non-profit organization, Alliance for C.H.A.N.G.E. (Creating Hope and New Goals Ethically).

David embodies the type of community member his organization envisions. He is generous with his time and personal resources – he teaches men how to use a cell phone and the internet, he offers both informational and emotional support to newcomers through 1:1 and small group "adventures" on public transit and throughout the city, and he looks for opportunities to connect recently released people with employment opportunities. He also freely volunteers his time to community improvement projects such as refurbishing the transitional home he began his own journey in 2011.

David and I have worked together to translate this personal generosity into formal services offered by the Alliance for CHANGE's reintegration services. For example, we have instituted the Alliance's "Day 1" services including:

- 1) picking men up from the gate upon release from San Quentin and going out for a first breakfast
- 2) providing a phone (paid up for 1 month) on each person's first day out to ensure their safety and enable them to reconnect with distant family and celebrate this hugely emotional transition
- 3) transporting each man to his parole office and transitional house to make sure the important early check-ins happen on time
- 4) most importantly, providing emotional and logistical support during what can be a stressful and confusing day.

David has been and will continue to be a great resource for men transitioning from incarceration into the San Francisco Bay Area; his participation on the Reentry Council of San Francisco will broaden his ability to be a force for good in his community, and greatly expand the Council's ability to make effective, rational and responsive services available to the men and women who so greatly need them.

My transition was also greatly facilitated by having my fiance there to assist me with moral, material, and logistical support (after 20 years of incarceration). Barriers that I've encountered are: lack of housing immediately following release (having to register as homeless because I am outside county of commitment and no family); not being provided resources to navigate around the city but yet expected to report to various locations at various times; not being able to visit my family despite my laudable programming on parole (full-time student at SFSU and part-time employed); no credit and background checks prevent housing opportunities; having a gap in my employment history (I was incarcerated at the age of 17 and released at 37).

In addition to founding and successfully managing two Bay Area transitional housing facilities for formerly incarcerated men for over seven years, I also have an extensive background in case management, drug and alcohol counseling and mental health assessment of formerly incarcerated individuals, veterans and individuals with mental health diagnoses. Over the last 13 years I have networked and collaborated extensively with a majority of existing reentry service organizations in the greater Bay Area (i.e. Waldenhouse/HealthRight 360, CJCJ, NOVA, SEOP etc.), as well as with the SF Adult Parole and Probation Department and Sherriff's Department.

One of the most effective strategies in regard to my successful reintegration was to build professional relationships with miscellaneous community based organizations while I was still incarcerated. One organization that was particular helpful to me was the Northern California Service League, which provided me with necessary life skills and job-readiness training upon my release, which prepared me well for an immediate entry-level job. However, without the fair hiring policies that the City of San Francisco implemented for formerly incarcerated individuals like me, I would not have been able to find immediate employment, provide for my family, and begin to rebuild my professional resume. Last but not least, with the support of Project Rebound — a special admission and retention program for formerly incarcerated students at SF State University — I was able to earn a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree. Higher education provided me with the professional skills and theoretical background I needed to significantly increase my professional opportunities in today's competitive job market and to make meaningful contributions to my field of expertise.

Some of the barriers I have experienced include but are not limited to the ongoing impact of the stigma of incarceration, my lack of relevant technology and computer skills, and my initial lack of access to professional mentors. The social barriers I experienced were just as difficult to overcome as my professional barriers. I had to slowly learn how to build meaningful social connection with others and to develop cultural competence in a new and unfamiliar social environment, without helpful guidance from other individuals who may have lived through similar experiences.

6. How can we help other people transition from prisons and jails more successfully? How can we help people permanently exit the criminal justice system?

It is important to actively create and facilitate more opportunities for currently incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals who are exciting the criminal justice system to have meaningful contact with formerly incarcerated individuals who have successfully mastered their own social and professional integration. These individuals are now in a unique position to function as role models, mentors and motivators who can provide still incarcerated or formerly incarcerated individuals with much needed social, emotional and professional support. Moreover, successfully reintegrated individuals have a clear understanding of the importance of positive working relationships between individuals currently on parole/probation and his/her law enforcement, probation or parole officers and in many cases also mental health care providers. Successful formerly incarcerated professionals are able to facilitate positive working relationships between all parties and to support open, respectful and constructive communication between all relevant entities with the goal of maximum fulfillment of parole/probation conditions necessary for successful reintegration. Positive working relationships have the potential to improve the overall attitude of parolees or individuals on probation toward law enforcement, probation and parole officers and they can significantly lessen possible distrust between those groups.

In my assessment, is critically important to recognize that the needs of formerly incarcerated individuals in regard to successful reintegration are multi-faceted and may differ greatly depending on individuals' contexts, for instance length of overall incarceration and how constructively they used their time while incarcerated. Different starting points will require different reintegration approaches.

In addition to providing formerly incarcerated individuals with stable housing, jobs, and access to higher education, it is important to allow incarcerated individuals the opportunity to discover their individual potential for change, to find their voices, and to heal themselves and their communities by giving back and by being of service to others. I believe that meaningful contribution allows incarcerated individuals to become stakeholders in their communities — perhaps for the first time in their lives — and to move past their prison identity.

7. What do you hope that the Reentry Council will achieve?

I hope that the Reentry Council will work as a team, representative of the communities we serve, to collaboratively analyze and address the reasons for the current revolving door recidivism with the common goals to increase public safety, to create a flexible and successful reentry model and to constructively influence relevant public policy. It is also my hope that the council will focus resources and support towards the majority of individuals who are willing and ready to change and become stakeholders in their communities and to develop more successful strategies to motivate the minority of individuals who are not.



What was your experience transitioning back to San Francisco after having been incarcerated? What helped you? What were the barriers?

Every area of my life was impacted after my release. My family and old associates were unfamiliar and the environment was overwhelmingly different. The juvenile court imposed dozens of limitations on me, including GPS monitoring. It was difficult to adjust to the workforce which resulted in me hopping from job to job. During this time my grandfather passed which had a silently devastating impact on me, I was lonely because I did not possess interpersonal relationship skills. Benefits included: A) involvement in a transitional housing program that provided both housing and a structured substance abuse treatment program requiring participation 5 days per week; B) Exposure to a large network of previously paroled ex-offenders who acted as peer mentors helping me to navigate through the variety of challenges that came up relative to parole such as obtaining identification, opening a bank account, learning how to use electronic devices, public transportation, obtaining health insurance and simply how to shop for food or clothes, among many other basic daily needs; C) Immediate access to substance abuse programs; D) Immediate access to a process group that provided stability and a safe place to "air" my concerns.

Challenges included: A) Not having sufficient identification upon release from prison; B) No access to my prison medical and dental records for issuance to my new health care providers; C) No immediate means to utilize public transportation due to lack of resources; D) Little or no availability to sufficient clothing.

I am 44 yr. old African-American male and a recovering drug addict. I have given over 20 years of my life to drug addiction and the cycle of incarceration. At one time, I was a plague to the community and I have now chosen to stop the vicious cycle that I was in so that I can now become a part of the solution instead of a part of the problem. It is time for me to give back to the community that I have taken from for so long.

Attachment B

In the past, I have held positions as a cashier, bus person, a volunteer for veterans and an electrical apprentice. I am presently affiliated with creation and start-up of From Scratch Bakery.

Attachment C

I give support and encouragement to other addicts and people who wish to achieve a better life.

Attachment 1-A

My transition back to San Francisco after being incarcerated has been very enlightening as far as the resources that are available to help me. What helped me the most was the support of my probation officer in helping me make the right decisions and putting forth the effort to assist me in any way that was within her power so that I could have the things I needed to turn my life toward a positive direction.

Although there are several barriers, one that stands out for me is housing that is conducive to my recovery. As a recovering addict, I need to stay away from people and places that revolve around the use of drugs. Yet, it seems that a majority of the housing available is right in the middle of the things that I want and need to stay away from to be successful.

I understand that it is my choice to participate in those activities but it must be understood that it is very stressful to have to face those things every time I walk out the door. That puts a lot pressure on me especially when I have just been released. Another barrier that I would like to address is employment. My conviction record makes gaining employment a serious challenge. Combined with a sporadic work history, finding meaningful employment that will allow me to support myself becomes a major obstacle.

Attachment 1-B

San Francisco has taken great steps in addressing the issue of transition for individuals exiting the jails and prisons. One of the first steps in transitioning back to society should begin while a person is still incarcerated. The reentry pod in the county jail is a very good beginning. One of the things that should be required is that a person, along with their case manager, develop a transition plan which details exactly what that person will be doing for the 3 to 6 months after release from custody.

Furthermore, I believe that a person should be entered into the reentry pod at least 90 to 120 days before they are released which is an adequate time for the individual to apply for and be accepted to needed services such as drug and housing. In doing so, a person has an immediate agenda when they are released.

I can also see that we need safe housing for those that have no place to go. It seems counterproductive to place a person right in the heart of everything that that person wants to stay away from when they are released. So I suggest that housing be found in an area that is more conducive to recovery and does not put unnecessary pressure on a person that is changing their life.

Income also is a major barrier when an individual is initially release d which causes many to fall back into illegal means to get money. Such behavior leads back into full blown criminality and drug use with re-incarceration being the end result. We need to get businesses in the community involved to hire individuals with criminal backgrounds that can fill entry level positions.

Finally, one of the things that can be done to help people permanently exit the criminal justice system is to have extended case management and support after a person is discharged from parole or probation for 6 months to 1 year.

The reason for this is because once a person has discharged supervision, that person is no allowed to receive any more services through the reentry program which can be detrimental if a person has not reached a point of stability. It is surely an individual's responsibility to take advantage of the services provided and it should be the program's responsibility to offer extended services to those that need it. I look forward to engaging with the Reentry Council as a whole and I hope that we can come together to put a plan in place that will be successful.

Attachment 1-C

I hope that the Reentry Council will achieve a significant reduction in the recidivism rate and a lowering of the number of people that are addicted to drugs and crime in this city. It is also my hope that with a collaborative effort between formerly incarcerated individuals, elected officials and the community, we will be able to bring serenity to those who have chosen to no longer live a life of chaos and despair.

Reentry Council of the City & County of San Francisco

The Reentry Council is created to coordinate local efforts to support adults exiting San Francisco County Jail, San Francisco juvenile justice system out-of-home placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population.

The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders. The council shall consist of 23 members, seven of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or his designee, shall serve as a member, and shall also appoint three of these seven members. The Board of Supervisors shall also serve as a member and appoint four of these seven members.

Note that among the seven former inmates appointed by the Mayor and Board of Supervisors, that at least two of the seven members shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system. At least one of these seven members must have been released from custody within two years of his or her appointment; at least one must have served multiple terms; and at least one must be between the ages of 18 to 24 at the time of appointment.

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office, Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department; Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency and the Department of Public Health.

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court; Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations; and the United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one member each to the Council. If any of these four agencies does not appoint a representative, the Council co-chairs shall appoint an additional member.

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms.

Seat 2: Must have been an inmate in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau or Prison facility; <u>AND</u> Must have experience in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system.

Seat 3: Must have been an inmate in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau or Prison facility; <u>AND Must have been released from custody within the last two years.</u>

Seat 4: Must have been an inmate in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau or Prison facility; <u>AND Must have served multiple terms of incarceration.</u>
