[Bail Schedule]

## Resolution urging the presiding judge of the Municipal Superior Court to convene the Judge's Bail Committee in conjunction with the Superior Court and in consultation with the San Francisco Police Department and the San Francisco Sheriff's Department to assess the bail schedule in order to determine what adjustments are needed to bring San Francisco in line with other Bay Area counties.

WHEREAS, The bail schedule is set by the judiciary and is used as a guideline for judges when a defendant first appears in court; and

WHEREAS, The bail schedule has not been adjusted since October of 1998 when Supervisor Jose Medina asked that a review be conducted; and,

WHEREAS, The bail schedule, when adjusted in 1998, was still lower than that of San Mateo County, Alameda County and Contra Costa County; and,

WHEREAS, Based on San Francisco's lower bail schedules, most suspected drug crime defendants find it easier to get out of jail while awaiting a trial in the City than in any of the surrounding Bay Area counties; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby urge the presiding judge of the Municipat Superior Court to convene the Judge's Bail Committee in conjunction with the Superior Court to assess the bail schedule in order to determine what adjustments are needed to bring San Francisco in line with other Bay Area counties; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Police and Sheriff's Departments are consulted regarding jail population and overcrowding during this assessment process.
