3 **Resolution declaring the results of the June 2, 2026, Consolidated Statewide Direct**
4 **Primary Election.**

6 WHEREAS, A Consolidated Statewide Direct Primary Election was conducted in the
7 City and County of San Francisco on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, which places before the
8 electorate candidates for the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, the Governing Board of the
9 San Francisco Unified School District, San Francisco Superior Court, and local ballot
10 measures; and

11 WHEREAS, John Arntz, the Director of Elections for the City and County of San
12 Francisco, has certified the results of the Consolidated Statewide Direct Primary Election, a
13 copy of which is contained in Board File No. 260753, and which is incorporated herein by
14 reference; now, therefore, be it

15 RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors declares, under California Elections Code,
16 Sections 9269 and 15400, the results of the Consolidated Statewide Primary Election
17 conducted in the City and County of San Francisco on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, as certified by
18 the Director of Elections, as follows:

10 SECTION 3. LOCAL BALLOT MEASURES.

11 Each measure listed below is declared adopted:

12 1. Bond

13 The following Bond required and received an affirmative vote of two-thirds (66.67%) of
14 the votes cast thereon and was therefore passed by the voters:

15 PROPOSITION A: Earthquake Safety and Emergency Response Bond

17 2. Charter Amendment

18 The following Charter Amendments required and received an affirmative vote of a
19 majority (50%, plus 1) of the votes cast thereon and were therefore passed by the
20 voters:

21 PROPOSITION B: Lifetime Term Limits for Mayor and Members of the Board of
22 Supervisors.

23 All other local ballot measures failed to meet the legally required vote thresholds for
24 adoption.
