111213	WHEREAS, Every food box is filled with nutritious foods seniors need to maintain their health, like canned tuna and chicken, cheese, rice, cereal, fruits and vegetables; and
14 15	WHEREAS, Beginning next month, more than 1000 low-income seniors in San Francisco will lose their monthly food boxes as the United States Department of Agriculture budgetary cutbacks begin to set in; and
16 17	WHEREAS, Participants in the program must have a monthly income below \$1,062 to qualify for CSFP; and
