RESOLUTION URGING THE AIRPORT COMMISSION TO REQUIRE THAT ALL PASSENGER AIRLINE COMPANIES REQUIRE THE PRESENCE OF BAGGAGE CHECKERS FOR ARRIVING FLIGHTS IN ORDER TO REDUCE INCIDENTS OF THEFT AND MISIDENTIFICATION OF BAGGAGE.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco International Airport is the fifth busiest in the nation and the ninth busiest in the world; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Airport Commission projects that there will be a projected 50% increase passenger traffic over the next 20 years at the San Francisco International Airport; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has allocated over \$2.8 billion for the expansion of Airport in order to accommodate the projected increase in the volume of passengers, number of flights and vehicular traffic; and

WHEREAS, Of the \$2.8 billion allocated, \$1 billion was allocated for the construction of a new 2.5 million square foot International Airport terminal which opened on December 10, 2000; and

WHEREAS, As part of the airport expansion, the construction new BART station to the airport, AirTrain transit that will link each of the terminals with the rental car garages and a new hotel; and

WHEREAS, Under the superb direction of the Airport Commission, the San Francisco International Airport has been transformed into a world class airport that will rank as one of the world's busiest and important airline terminal; and

WHEREAS, Unlike other world class airport terminals, the majority of passenger airlines do not provide baggage checkers that insure that arriving passengers with baggage retrieve the correct baggage by matching the claim check with the baggage check; and

WHEREAS, Airline passengers often complain of having their luggage and valuables stolen and still other passengers sometimes unknowingly retrieve the wrong baggage; and

WHEREAS, The presence of airline staff and baggage checkers would greatly minimize the incidence of theft and retrieval of wrong luggage; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Airport Commission to require that all passenger airline companies require the presence of baggage checkers for arriving flights in order to reduce incidents of theft and misidentification of baggage.
