7 WHEREAS, Statistics estimate more than 12 million illegal immigrants are living in the  
8 United States, many of whom are Mexican; and,

9 WHEREAS, Many illegal immigrants are fearful of financial institutions and the  
10 paperwork involved, resulting in a lack of basic services, higher cost of borrowing, and  
11 vulnerability to crime; and,

12 WHEREAS; Wells Fargo Bank will now accept identification cards issued by the  
13 Mexican government as a primary form of identification for new account openings and over-  
14 the-counter transactions; and,

15 WHEREAS; Wells Fargo Bank, with more than 3,00 branches in 23 states, is the  
16 largest institution to adopt such an equal-access policy towards the Hispanic and illegal  
17 immigrant community, now, therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors commends Wells Fargo Bank, their outreach to  
19 the Hispanic community, and their efforts to grant basic services and equal access to illegal  
20 immigrants; and, be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors sends this resolution to  
22 the Wells Fargo Bank's office of community relations.




