

1 [Support for Assembly Bill 202]

2 URGING GOVERNOR GRAY DAVIS TO SUPPORT ASSEMBLY BILL 202.

3 WHEREAS, Existing law regulates the sale of firearms and prohibits the sale of certain
4 specified firearms, but does not otherwise limit the number of firearms that a qualified person
5 may purchase; and,

6 WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 202 (A.B. 202) would make it a misdemeanor or a felony for
7 any dealer to deliver a pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the
8 person following notice from the Department of Justice that, within the preceding 30-day
9 period, the purchaser has made another application to purchase a concealable firearm; and,
10

11 WHEREAS, A.B. 202 would also provide that, except as specified, any person who
12 makes an application to purchase more than one concealable firearm within any 30-day
13 period is guilty of either an infraction or misdemeanor depending upon the number of
14 violations committed by that person; and,

16 WHEREAS, In essence, A.B. 202 would contribute towards impeding the flow of hand
17 guns to unqualified purchasers-with an arrest record, a stay away order obtained by a
18 battered spouse, or a history of mental illness-by prohibiting qualified purchasers from buying
19 multiple hand guns in a given month and reselling them on the black market; now, therefore,

22 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
23 urges Governor Gray Davis to sign A.B. 202.




