- 3. The Immigrant Rights Commission has attempted to fill the position, for which Mario Paz was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Mario Paz is qualified to serve on the Immigrant Rights Commission.
