# Background

Three grant agreements are on today's agenda:

- Young Community Developers - Black to the Future
- Japanese Community Youth Council – Youth Works
- Japanese Community Youth Council – OFA

Historically, DCYF grant agreements have not exceed \$10M. Due to the COVID-19 emergency, DCYF extended its current five-year grant making cycle by one year. In addition, additional/above-base funding was added to these contracts

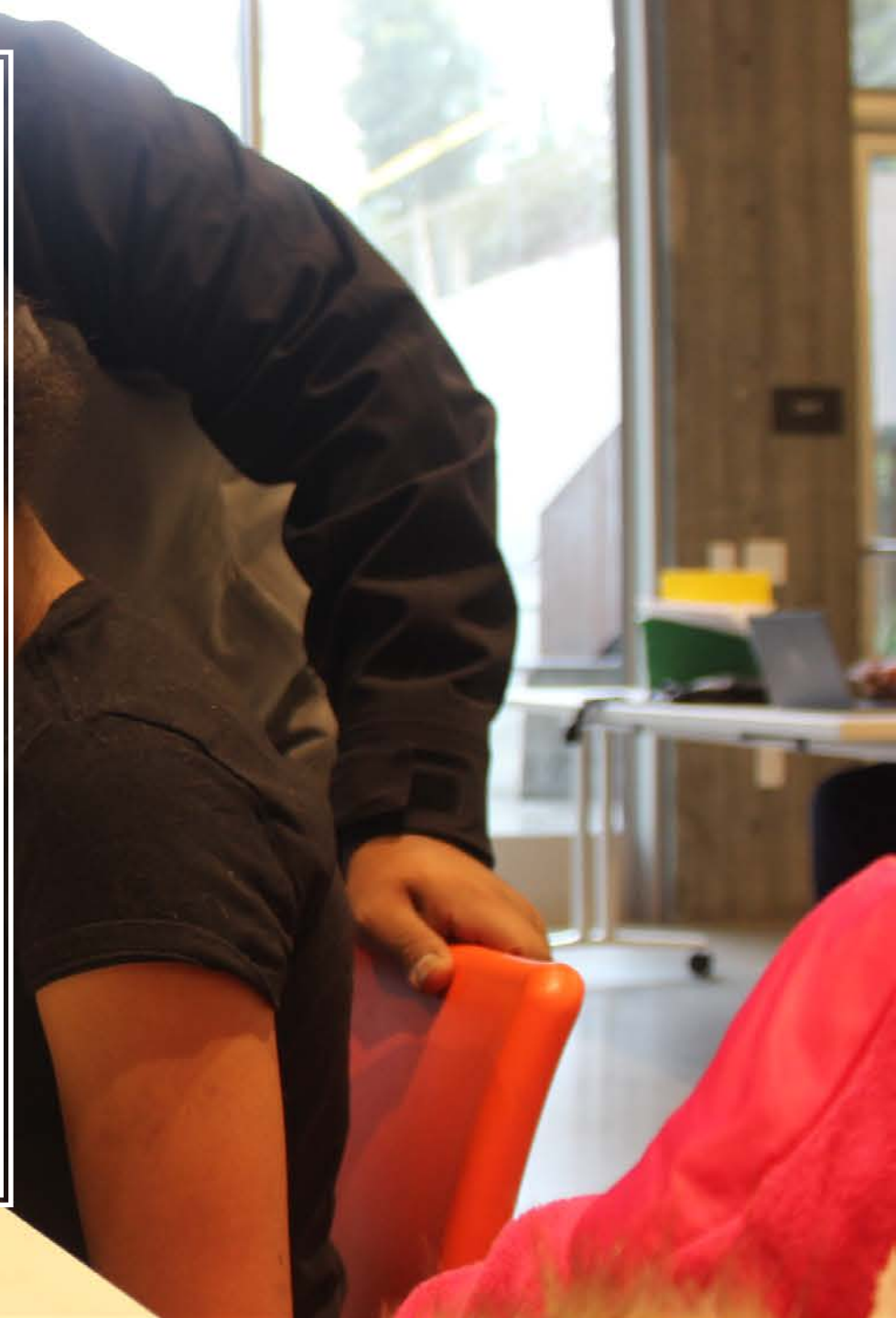
# Black to the Future – Young Community Developers

- Retroactive approval for second amendment – extending term to June 2024 and increasing not to exceed amount
- Black to the Future provides educational and employment-based trainings for Bayview Hunters Point residents – serving approximately 165 children and young adults each year.
- Black to the Future partners with several African American-led agencies and agencies that serve a majority of African American children, youth, TAY and families.



# Japanese Community Youth Council – SF YouthWorks

- Second amendment to the grant agreement – extends the term to June 2024 and increases not to exceed amount
- YouthWorks is a citywide year-round program that places 11th and 12th grade San Francisco students in paid internships in City departments.
- The program serves approximately 400 student interns per year



# Japanese Community Youth Council – OFA

- Third amendment to the grant agreement – extends the term to June 2024 and increases not to exceed amount
- Opportunities for All (OFA) connects young people in San Francisco to paid employment, mentorship and job training services
- Through a community engagement process JCYC was identified as the lead contractor for OFA.
- The main criteria for selection of this grantee were:
  - The ability to leverage existing programs and funding such as MYEEP, YouthWorks, Project Pull and others
  - The ability to onboard and enroll hundreds of youth
  - The ability to serve as employer of record, cover insurance and work with employers
  - Has an established and longstanding relationships with youth, community-based organizations and stakeholders
- We have made pivots over the last few years to expand and support partners from diverse communities to work with several CBOs.
