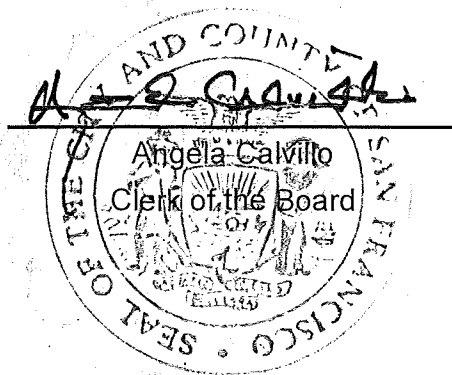

11 1980's, which increases the exposure to the risk factors that lead to crime; and

12 WHEREAS, Immediately after his 18th birthday in 1994, Kang Hen was arrested for
13 driving two friends away from a robbery attempt; and

14 WHEREAS, Kang Hen was charged as an accomplice in the robbery by the Santa
15 Clara District Attorney and was failed to be convicted by the jury twice; and

16 WHEREAS, After spending four years in jail without conviction, Kang Hen accepted a
17 plea deal that would allow him to get credit for time served without realizing that he would be
18 ordered to be deported; and

19 WHEREAS, Since his arrest in 1994, Kang Hen has had no further interaction with law
