

1 [Accept-Expend Metropolitan Transportation Commission Grant and Amendment to the  
2 Annual Salary Ordinance, FY 2008-2009.]

4 **Ordinance authorizing the Department of the Environment to accept and expend a**  
5 **grant up to the amount of \$210,000 over the next three fiscal years from the**  
6 **Metropolitan Transportation Commission to provide Transportation Demand**  
7 **Management services to employers on behalf of the 511 Regional Rideshare Program,**  
8 **with the City providing 11.47% of the project costs, and amending Annual Salary**  
9 **Ordinance Number 141-08 to reflect the addition of one (1) grant funded position at the**  
10 **Department of the Environment.**

15 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

### 16 **SEC 1. Findings**

17 The Board of Supervisors for the City and County of San Francisco adopted the  
18 Sustainability Plan for the City and County of San Francisco which states that "[a]chieving and  
19 maintaining good air quality is crucial to the public health and economic vitality of San  
20 Francisco".

21 In 2002, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors passed an ordinance committing the  
22 City and County of San Francisco to make significant greenhouse gas reductions, far  
23 exceeding the targets in the Kyoto Protocol.

24 In 2004 SF Environment and the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission released a  
25 "Climate Action Plan for San Francisco" identifying transportation, energy efficiency,

1 renewable energy, and solid waste measures that could achieve reductions sufficient to meet  
2 this target.

3 Automobile emissions contribute to poor air quality and are a source of green house  
4 gases.

5 The project will help the City meet its reducing the number of individuals driving  
6 automobiles which will help the City achieve and maintain good air quality, as well as reduce  
7 greenhouse gases.

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9 **SEC 2. Authorization to Accept and Expend Funds.**

10 The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Department of the Environment to  
11 accept and expend on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco up to \$210,000 in funds  
12 from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission over the next three fiscal years to provide  
13 Transportation Demand Management services to employers.

14 The grant requires the Department of the Environment to match 11.47% of the project  
15 costs or nine thousand sixty-nine dollars \$9,069 per fiscal year over the next three years.

16 The grant further requires the Department of the Environment to provide staff support  
17 and any additional funding necessary to complete the project.

18 The Department of the Environment is further authorized to furnish whatever additional  
19 information or assurances the funding agency may request in connection with this grant, and  
20 to execute any and all agreements necessary to carry out the purpose of the grant.

21 The term of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission grant is from July 2008  
22 through June 2011.

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24 **SEC. 3. Grant-funded Positions; Amendment to FY 2008-2009 Annual Salary Ordinance.**  
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1           The hereinafter designated sections and items of Ordinance No. 141-08 (Annual Salary  
2 Ordinance, FY 2008-2009) are hereby amended to ADD ONE (1) position in the Department  
3 of the Environment, and reads as follows:
