

1 [Accept-Expend Federal Pass Through Grant]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the Office of Emergency Services to accept and expend a**
4 **Federal pass through grant in the amount of \$26,325,036 from the State of California**
5 **Office of Homeland Security for the purposes of providing financial assistance directly**
6 **to selected jurisdictions through the Fiscal Year 2004 Urban Areas Security Initiative**
7 **(UASI) to address the unique equipment, training, planning, and exercise needs of**
8 **large urban areas, and to assist them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity**
9 **to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism.**

11 WHEREAS, In 2003 the California Office of Homeland Security distributed more than
12 \$226 million in federal homeland security funds to provides state and local governments with
13 the vital funding they require to participate in the national effort to combat terrorism; and,

14 WHEREAS, Last year, the City and County of San Francisco was selected as one of
15 five High Threat Urban Area sites in the Country, receiving a total of over \$28 million dollars;
16 and,

17 WHEREAS, California is now recognized as having a greater number of high threat
18 sites, causing the Federal government to announce the selection of an additional five cities
19 selected to receive financial assistance totaling \$135.25 million dollars under the Fiscal Year
20 2004 Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant Program; and,

21 WHEREAS, the Urban Area of San Francisco is eligible to receive up to \$26,325,036;
22 and,

23 WHEREAS, Funds received must be expended no later than November 30, 2005; and,

24 WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provisions for indirect costs, indirect costs
25 are requested to be waived; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the Office
2 of Emergency Services to accept and expend a Federal Pass Through Grant in the amount of
3 \$26,325,036 from the State of California Office of Homeland Security for the purposes of
4 providing financial assistance directly to selected jurisdictions through the Fiscal Year 2004
5 Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) to address the unique equipment, training, planning,
6 and exercise needs of large urban areas, and to assist them in building an enhanced and
7 sustainable capacity to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism.
