18 determine and fix the proper reasonable amounts to be charged to persons for services  
19 furnished by the Department of Public Health as follows, which rates shall be effective for  
20 services delivered as of ~~*July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2018*~~ *July 1, 2017, through June 30, 2019.*

Section 2. Special price lists referenced in Section 128 of the Health Code are available on request at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving of it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. As stated in Section 128 of the Health Code, the rates specified therein shall apply starting July 1, 2017.

Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the municipal code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment

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additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

**Ordinance amending the Health Code to set patient rates and other services provided by the Department of Public Health for patient and other services rendered, starting July 1, 2017, and continuing through June 30, 2019.**

Existing Law

San Francisco Health Code Section 128 sets forth the amounts to be charged for patient care and other services provided by the Department of Public Health.

Amendments to Current Law

This amendment increases the amounts to be charged for patient care and other services provided by the Department of Public Health.

Background Information

Consistent with the health care industry, the Department of Public Health reviews the rates charged for patient care and other services each year. This amendment will increase the rates for hospital services by 7% effective July 1, 2017 and an additional 6% effective July 1, 2018. Other rates are increased based on increases in actual costs.
