WHEREAS, Pursuant to companion Board of Supervisors Resolution Ordinance and ______, adopted on ____, 1998, 330-98 331-98 Nos. the City, including through its Port Commission (the "Port"), intends to enter into amendments and restatements of the Mission Bay City Land Transfer Agreement (the "Amended CLTA") with Catellus Development Corporation ("Catellus") and into the Mission Bay Port Land Transfer Agreement (the "Amended PLTA") with Catellus, and the City, including the Port, intends to enter into an amendment and restatement of the Agreement Concerning the Public Trust (the "Amended ACPT") with Catellus and the State of California, pertaining to the transfer and exchange of certain land in Mission Bay, including the Property, and copies of
