10	operation of City government; and		
11	WHEREAS, The City and County has no formalized procedures governing transition		
12	and current methods employed vary from office to office; now, therefore, be it		
13	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco		
14	hereby requests that the City Attorney, in consultation with current and former officeholders		
15	and their staff, the City Controller and other individuals with extensive local government		
16	experience, develop proposed transition management plans for each elective office of the Ci		
17	and County, commencing with the office of Mayor; and, be it		
18	FURTHER RESOLVED, That such plans should present a summary of current law,		
19	recommendations and policy options based on interviews with the individuals identified in the		
20	preceding paragraph and transition plans in other governmental offices that could serve as		
21	models for San Francisco; and, be it		
22	FURTHER RESOLVED, That such plans should include, but not be limited to, the		
23	following:		
24	(a)	Selecting a transition team;	
25	(b)	Sunshine and records rentention;

2	(d)	Exit interviews with outgoing officeholders and their staff; and	
3	(e)	Recommended interviews with other City staff; and, be it	
4	FURTHER RESOLVED, That with respect to transition to a new mayoral		
5	administration, a plan should include the following:		
6	(a)	Department briefings;	
7	(b)	Choosing commissioners;	
8	(c)	Department director selection process; and	
9	(d)	Critical timelines during the first six months of an administration; and, be it	
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the City Attorney, in		
11	responding to this request, to incorporate recommendations that constitute policy advice in the		
12	form of reports of interviews conducted; and, be it		
13	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors Board may, based on the City		
14	Attorney's report, consider adopting formal City policy for transition planning.
