[Credit Union Membership Access Act]

COMMENDING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS FOR PASSING THE CREDIT UNION MEMBERSHIP ACCESS ACT

WHEREAS, On February 25, 1998 in <u>National Credit Union v. First National Bank and Trust</u>, the United State Supreme Court restricted the eligibility of credit union members to customers who belong to one employer or community; and,

WHEREAS, Because of their tax-exempt status, credit unions are able to charge less for checking accounts, loans, and other services and to offer investments with higher returns; and,

WHEREAS, On August 4, 1998 Congress passed the Credit Union Membership Access Act; and,

WHEREAS, The Credit Union Membership Access Act will allow credit unions to include more than one employer's workers in their memberships; and,

WHEREAS, The Credit Union Membership Access Act will provide low-cost credit union service to millions of employees of small businesses; and,

WHEREAS, The Credit Union Membership Access Act will also expand the availability of financial services to small communities and under served neighborhoods; and,

WHEREAS, The Credit Union Membership Access Act is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 98-1345; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends the United States Congress for passing the Credit Union Membership Access Act; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from California in Congress.
