Happy Sunday neighbors,

For those of you concerned with unsafe traffic conditions on our streets, an **important vote is up this Tuesday, July 14, at the Board of Supervisors Meeting: Supervisor Dorsey has introduced Resolution 260499 to expand the current speed camera program, now a pilot project involving 33 intersections, across the City.** Per Walk SF, a [note on the program effectiveness](#):

"According to data from the SFMTA, the share of drivers speeding 10 MPH or more is down nearly 80% across the 33 speed camera locations. And drivers are changing their behavior: about two-thirds of drivers who have received a warning or citation did not get another one."

We have actively advocated—along with the City, WalkSF and the Vision Zero Coalition—for this program for 8 years prior to its passage, and we support this resolution to expand the program. Pasted below is a letter we have sent to our Board of Supervisors. **If you share our perspective, we encourage you to write too;** supervisors' email addresses are given. Feel free to copy all or parts of our letter (substituting YOUR name, of course!) and email it by tomorrow (Monday) noon. Or just forward the letter in whole and note that you support the request.

All seem administrative, so more an FYI than a call to action.

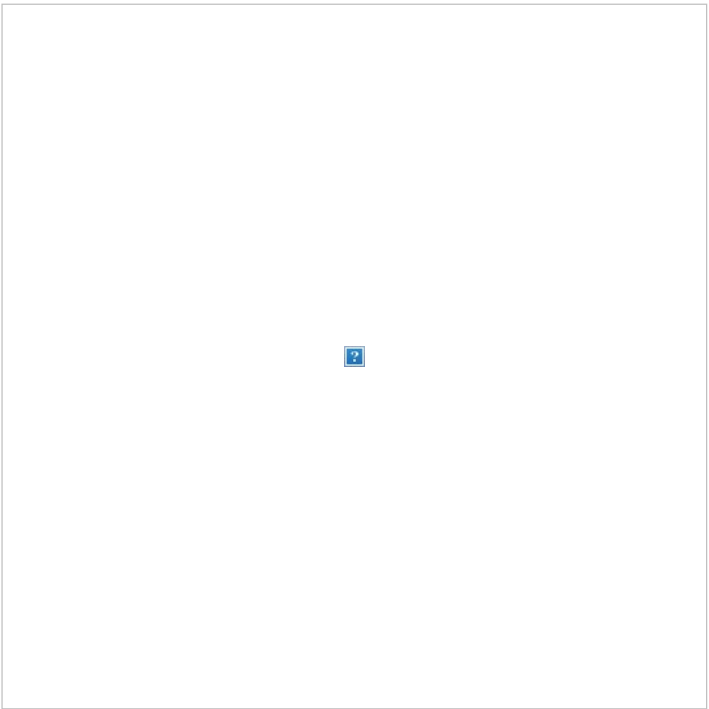
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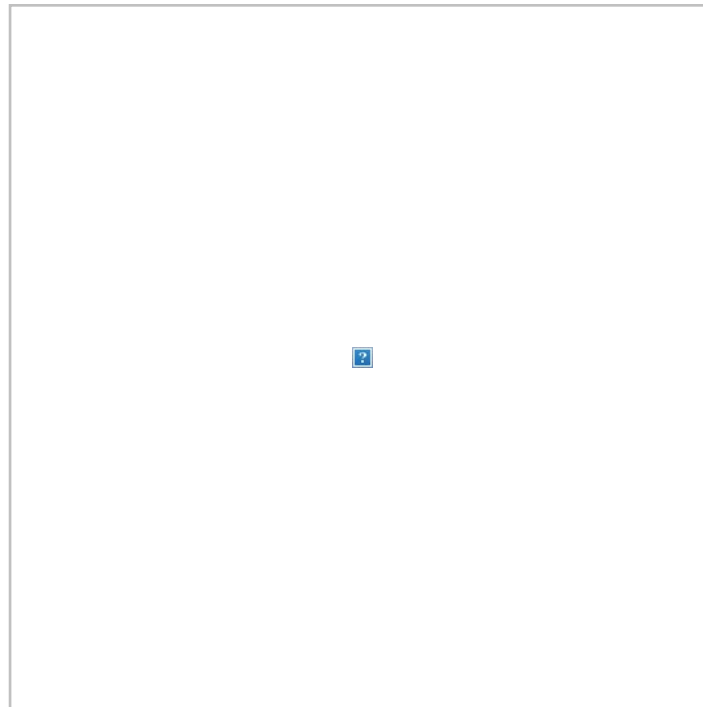

I am writing you to express complete support for the expansion of the speed camera program in San Francisco.

I have lived in San Francisco for 13 years, and in that time, especially most recently, I've been beyond shocked at the way the drivers conduct themselves in the city.

They speed recklessly throughout the city, routinely drive-through red lights, and appear to completely disregard the rights and safety of pedestrians—and even of the other drivers who choose to respect the speed limit.

I found it fascinating in the recent article that I came across that spurred me to write this email, that there are privacy concerns regarding the program.

We're talking about human life here, and the constant news reports of people who have died or been injured due to reckless driving should be evidence enough that this program must be expanded.
