WHEREAS, Heritage on the Marina has long served as a beacon of community commitment within San Francisco, originally founded by the San Francisco Ladies' Protection and Relief Society to aid women and children, and evolving into a care home for San Francisco's elderly; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Ladies' Protection and Relief Society was established in 1853 by a group of women who recognized the urgent need to provide shelter and support to vulnerable women and children, laying the foundation for what would become one of the city's most enduring charitable organizations; and

WHEREAS, In 1922, the Society commissioned Julia Morgan, California's first licensed female architect, whose groundbreaking work helped shape the state's architectural legacy, to design the current facility;

WHEREAS, The construction of the facility was made possible through the generosity of sisters Edith and Lucy Allyne, descendants of early San Francisco pioneers, whose contributions ensured the expansion and long-term sustainability of the institution; and

WHEREAS, Since its opening in 1925, Heritage on the Marina has continued to uphold its mission of service, offering care and community to elderly residents while preserving the rich legacy of the women who built and sustained it; and

WHEREAS, March 2025 marks the 100th anniversary of Heritage on the Marina, celebrating a century of impactful service to the community and honoring its role as a longstanding pillar of support and care for its residents; and

WHEREAS, The institution has consistently demonstrated leadership in preserving architectural integrity while fostering an inclusive environment that respects and honors its residents' contributions to the community; and

WHEREAS, In celebration of Women's History Month, the commendation recognizes the generations of women who have played a critical role in the history and development of Heritage on the Marina, from its founders and benefactors to the caregivers and residents who have shaped its legacy; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby commend Heritage on the Marina for its outstanding service to the community, preserving both the social and architectural history of the Marina District; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors declares March 27, 2025, as Heritage on the Marina Day in the City and County of San Francisco, in recognition of its historical significance and continuous dedication to serving the community with integrity and care.
