URGING THE PLANNING COMMITTEE FOR THE INTERNATIONAL GAY AND LESBIAN HISTORY MUSEUM TO STRONGLY CONSIDER THE CITY OF SAN FRANCISCO AS THE

SITE OF THE MUSEUM.

WHEREAS, San Francisco is a world-renowned center of lesbian and gay culture with a long and proud history of acceptance and celebration of the lives of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender individuals; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco was one of the first cities in the United States to embrace the cause of equal rights for gays and lesbians and is a unique place where gays and lesbians are able to feel at home, free, and comfortable; and,

WHEREAS, In addition to the political legend of Harvey Milk and many other prominent gay and lesbian elected officials, San Francisco has demonstrated its commitment to the gay and lesbian community through the establishment of the Community Center Project, an ambitious queer community center currently under construction in San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, A similarly ambitious national effort is underway to create the International Museum of Gay and Lesbian History which will celebrate the lives and accomplishments of gay and lesbian individuals throughout history; and,

WHEREAS, The decision on where to locate the museum will be made by the planning committee for the museum sometime in 2004, with the groundbreaking for the building to occur sometime around 2010; and,

WHEREAS, Numerous San Francisco non-profit organizations involved with the preservation and celebration of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history, such as the Lesbian & Gay Historical Society of Northern California, Harvey Milk Institute, San Francisco Pride Committee, Queer Cultural Center and Frameline, have expressed a strong desire to

work with city and state government agencies and potential corporate sponsors to encourage the museum to locate in San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, Because of its deep roots in the gay rights movement, its thriving tourist industry that brings thousands of lesbian and gay travelers to the city every year, and its robust community of non-profit organizations that can work together in a coordinated, proactive way to attract the kind of support and funding needed to make the project a success, San Francisco is an ideal location for the museum; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges the planning committee for the International Gay and Lesbian History Museum to strongly consider the city of San Francisco as the site of the museum.
