

1 [Accept-Expend State Grant – Criminal Restitution Compact]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Department of the District Attorney of the City and County**  
4 **of San Francisco to retroactively contract for, accept and expend up to \$88,538**  
5 **allocated from the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board for a**  
6 **project entitled the Criminal Restitution Compact for the period of July 1, 2009 through**  
7 **June 30, 2011.**

9 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco desires to enter into an agreement  
10 with the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board in accordance with  
11 Government Section 13835 for the purpose of ensuring that restitution fines and orders are  
12 properly administered; and

13 WHEREAS, Funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant local funds that  
14 would, in the absence of California victim Compensation and Government Claims Board  
15 Programs, be made available to support the assistance of victims and witnesses of crime;  
16 and,

17 WHEREAS, All positions supported by these funds shall be coded “G” in the District  
18 Attorney’s budget; and

19 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$8,049; and

20 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; now, therefore, be it

21 **RESOLVED**, That the District Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco is  
22 authorized on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco to contract for, accept and  
23 expend funds from the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board to  
24 continue the Criminal Restitution Compact, including any extensions, augmentations or  
25 amendments thereof.
