[Support of Cleaner School Buses for the San Francisco Unified School District]

Resolution supporting Cleaner School Buses for the San Francisco Unified School District and urging the School District to aggressively pursue a new bus contract that would adhere to all the goals of the city to run clean, low-emission buses.

WHEREAS, Children in San Francisco are exposed, on a daily basis, to a significant amount of diesel exhaust from old diesel fueled school buses; and

WHEREAS, Diesel exhaust has identified by the California Air Resources Board to increase cancer risk, contribute to premature deaths, increase respiratory illnesses, exacerbate asthma and potentially lead to the onset of asthma; and

WHEREAS, Nitrogen oxides (NOx), another significant component of diesel exhaust, is a major contributor to ozone production and smog, and has recently been connected with decrease lung function growth in children; and

WHEREAS, Children are most susceptible to the negative health effects of diesel exhaust exposure because: (1) children's developing body is less capable of defending itself against pollutants such as diesel particles, (2) children typically breathe twice as much air per their body weight as adults, thereby receiving greater doses of pollution, and (3) children tend to breathe through their mouths, thereby bypassing the natural filtering protections of the nose; and

WHEREAS, School buses used to transport children in the San Francisco Unified School District are among one of the highest polluting vehicles on the road today; and

WHEREAS, Several studies have demonstrated that that children riding school buses are exposed to greater levels of diesel exhaust inside a school bus compared to levels of diesel exhaust found outside a school bus and that diesel exhaust accumulates in the back of the school bus; and

WHEREAS, Cleaner and healthier alternatives to conventional diesel school buses exist, including natural gas school buses and advanced low-emitting diesel buses using particulate traps and ultra-low sulfur fuel, that are widely available, have been proven to be durable, and that emit less particulate matter, NOx and other air toxic; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco is committed to ensure cleaner and healthier buses for children as suggested by the public's overwhelming support (nearly 70%) of Proposition I, the Replacement of Diesel Buses operated by MUNI; and, therefore be it

RESOLVED that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors strongly supports cleaner School Buses for the San Francisco Unified School District and urging the School District to aggressively pursue a new bus contract that would adhere to all the goals of the city to run clean, low-emission buses.
