	Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), and urging Senators Boxer and
5	Feinstein to make every effort to ensure Senate ratification of CEDAW.

7 8	WHEREAS, The Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against
9	Women (CEDAW) is the most comprehensive international agreement on the basic human
10	rights of women; and
11	WHEREAS, CEDAW has improved the lives of women in ratifying nations by
12	overcoming barriers to women in the spheres of education, employment, health care, politics
13	and economics, among others; and
14	WHEREAS, The United States was a primary drafter of CEDAW in 1979; and
15	WHEREAS, President Jimmy Carter signed the CEDAW Treaty in 1980; and
16	WHEREAS, CEDAW has languished in the United States Senate for more than twenty
17	years without being ratified; and
18	WHEREAS, the United States remains the only industrialized country that has not
19	ratified the Convention, while CEDAW has been ratified in 170 nations; and
20	WHEREAS, United States demands for an end to human rights abuses to women
21	elsewhere in the world ring false while the United States fails to demonstrate its own
22	commitment to women's rights by ratifying the Treaty it helped create; and
23	WHEREAS, San Francisco adopted CEDAW in 1998, thereby reflecting the City and
24	County's commitment to women's rights; and

1	WHEREAS, San Francisco remains the only City and County to have fully translated
2	CEDAW into law in the United States; and
3	WHEREAS, the Senate is presently reconsidering the ratification of CEDAW, through
4	the able leadership of Senator Barbara Boxer and Senator Joe Biden in the Foreign Relations
5	Committee; now, therefore, be it
6	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
7	reaffirm its commitment to the United States ratification of the Convention for the Elimination
8	of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women; and, be it
9	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
10	Francisco commend Senator Barbara Boxer for the leadership she has shown in championing
11	the ratification of CEDAW; and, be it
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
13	Francisco urge Senator Boxer and Senator Feinstein to make every effort to work towards the
14	ratification of CEDAW in the Senate, thereby restoring US credibility regarding women's
15	rights; and, be it
16	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall send a copy
17	of this Resolution to Senators Barbara Boxer and Dianne Feinstein.
