- Department Reports to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community 5 (a) 6 **Development.** By no later than July 1, 2021 September 1, 2025, the departments listed in this 7 subsection (a) shall submit to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development 8 reports containing an assessment of relevant assets and needs in the District, 9 recommendations on programs, policies, and funding sources that could benefit the District, 10 and other recommendations that could serve the District to advance the goals of this Chapter 11 107A. Each department shall seek the input of the African American Arts and Cultural District 12 Community Advisory Committee established in Chapter 5, Article XXX of the Administrative 13 Code, during that committee's existence, as well as the input of residents, businesses, and 14 organizations in the District, when compiling the information relevant for the reports and when 15 deciding on recommendations. 16 (1)The Historic Preservation Commission's report shall describe and
- evaluate historic resources in the District and make recommendations regarding how the City
 may preserve those resources.
- 19 (2) The Office of Economic and Workforce Development's report shall (A)
 20 describe existing businesses and nonprofit organizations that contribute to the culture of the
 21 District, and make recommendations regarding how the City may serve those businesses and
 22 organizations; and (B) describe tourist activity in the District, and make recommendations
 23 regarding how the City can sustain and increase that activity.
- 24 (3) The Arts Commission's report shall describe the artistic and cultural
 25 assets in the District, including fine arts, performing arts, and regular cultural events like

festivals, and make recommendations about how the City may preserve and support those

14 (b) Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report. 15 By no later than *December 31, 2021* February 1, 2026, the Mayor's Office of Housing and 16 Community Development shall prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor 17 a Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report ("CHHESS Report") 18 for the District. The CHHESS Report shall include a demographic and economic profile of the 19 District, including past, current, and future trends; analyze and record the tangible and 20 intangible elements of the District's cultural heritage; identify areas of concern that could 21 inhibit the preservation of the District's unique culture; and propose legislative, economic, and 22 other solutions and strategies to support the District. The CHHESS Report shall discuss or 23 incorporate the findings and recommendations of departments in the reports required by 24 subsection (a) of this Section 107A.2. In preparing the CHHESS Report, the Mayor's Office of 25 Housing and Community Development shall solicit recommendations and *inputfeedback* from

the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee, and
 spearhead a community engagement process with residents, businesses, and workers in the
 District, *in order* to develop the strategies and plans that will preserve and enhance the culture

4 of the District.

(c) Timeline Extensions. The Board of Supervisors may extend any of the
deadlines in subsections (a) or (b) of this Section 107A.2 by resolution. Prior to requesting
that the Board extend a deadline, any department requesting such an extension shall notify
the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee in writing <u>of</u> *the reason for the requested extension*.

(d) Board of Supervisors Consideration. Following receipt of the CHHESS
 Report from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Board of
 Supervisors may take any action that the Board deems appropriate, including, by resolution,
 approving the report, modifying the report, rejecting the report, or requesting additional
 information or analysis from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development or
 any other City department or agency.

(e) **Progress Reports.** The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community
Development shall provide a progress report on the strategies outlined in the CHHESS Report
at least once every three years following the Board of Supervisors' enactment of a resolution
approving or modifying the CHHESS Report.

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Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to reestablish the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee, extend the deadlines for the written reports and recommendations from City departments describing the cultural attributes of the African American Arts and Cultural District, and propose strategies to acknowledge and preserve the cultural legacy of the District.

Existing Law

Section 107.3(f) of the Administrative Code established the African American Arts and Cultural District ("District"), which generally includes the Bayview, Hunters Point, and Silver Terrace neighborhoods. With input from other City departments, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development ("MOHCD") is required to prepare a report regarding the culture, history, housing, and economic sustainability of the District.

The Administrative Code previously established the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee ("Committee"), which was authorized to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and MOHCD concerning issues relating to the District and on the report MOHCD must prepare. The sections of the Administrative Code that authorized the Committee expired and were removed from the Code.

Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance amends the Administrative Code to reestablish the Committee. The Committee will again consist of seven members nominated by the District 10 Supervisor and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Committee will advise the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, and MOHCD concerning the District and on the required reports. The Committee will sunset on June 30, 2028.

The ordinance also extends the deadlines for MOHCD to prepare its report and the deadline for City departments to submit their reports to MOHCD.

SEC. 107A.2. REQUIRED REPORTS.

- Department Reports to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community 5 (a) 6 **Development.** By no later than July 1, 2021 September 1, 2025, the departments listed in this 7 subsection (a) shall submit to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development 8 reports containing an assessment of relevant assets and needs in the District, 9 recommendations on programs, policies, and funding sources that could benefit the District, 10 and other recommendations that could serve the District to advance the goals of this Chapter 11 107A. Each department shall seek the input of the African American Arts and Cultural District 12 Community Advisory Committee established in Chapter 5, Article XXX of the Administrative 13 Code, during that committee's existence, as well as the input of residents, businesses, and 14 organizations in the District, when compiling the information relevant for the reports and when 15 deciding on recommendations. 16 (1)The Historic Preservation Commission's report shall describe and
- 17 evaluate historic resources in the District and make recommendations regarding how the City
 18 may preserve those resources.
- 19 (2) The Office of Economic and Workforce Development's report shall (A)
 20 describe existing businesses and nonprofit organizations that contribute to the culture of the
 21 District, and make recommendations regarding how the City may serve those businesses and

14 (b) Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report. 15 By no later than *December 31, 2021* February 1, 2026, the Mayor's Office of Housing and 16 Community Development shall prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor 17 a Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report ("CHHESS Report") 18 for the District. The CHHESS Report shall include a demographic and economic profile of the 19 District, including past, current, and future trends; analyze and record the tangible and 20 intangible elements of the District's cultural heritage; identify areas of concern that could 21 inhibit the preservation of the District's unique culture; and propose legislative, economic, and 22 other solutions and strategies to support the District. The CHHESS Report shall discuss or 23 incorporate the findings and recommendations of departments in the reports required by 24 subsection (a) of this Section 107A.2. In preparing the CHHESS Report, the Mayor's Office of 25 Housing and Community Development shall solicit recommendations and *inputfeedback* from

1 the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee, and

spearhead a community engagement process with residents, businesses, and workers in the
District, *in order* to develop the strategies and plans that will preserve and enhance the culture
of the District.

5 (c) **Timeline Extensions.** The Board of Supervisors may extend any of the 6 deadlines in subsections (a) or (b) of this Section 107A.2 by resolution. Prior to requesting 7 that the Board extend a deadline, any department requesting such an extension shall notify 8 the African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee in writing <u>of</u> 9 *the reason for the requested extension*.

(d) Board of Supervisors Consideration. Following receipt of the CHHESS
 Report from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Board of
 Supervisors may take any action that the Board deems appropriate, including, by resolution,
 approving the report, modifying the report, rejecting the report, or requesting additional
 information or analysis from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development or
 any other City department or agency.

(e) **Progress Reports.** The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community
 Development shall provide a progress report on the strategies outlined in the CHHESS Report
 at least once every three years following the Board of Supervisors' enactment of a resolution
 approving or modifying the CHHESS Report.

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Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
