1 [ FEDERAL GRANT ]

2 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL TO RETROACTIVELY APPLY,  
3 ACCEPT AND EXPEND FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$534,337 FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT  
4 OF JUSTICE OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS (OJP), UNDER THE VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN  
5 ACT PROGRAM, TO (1) SUPPORT SERVICES TO YOUNG WOMEN OFFENDERS, WHO HAVE  
6 BEEN VICTIMS OF SEXUAL AND DOMESTIC ABUSE, THROUGH THE LIFE LEARNING  
7 RESIDENTIAL CENTER FOR GIRLS, A COMPONENT OF THE MAYOR'S LOCAL ACTION PLAN  
8 FOR JUVENILE JUSTICE REFORM AND (2) PROVIDING EFFECTIVE BATTERERS'  
9 INTERVENTION SERVICES TO YOUNG MEN BY PROVINDING RESOURCES TO THE JUVENILE  
10 PROBATION DEPARTMENT AND AN ANTI-VIOLENCE COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATION,  
11 MEN OVERCOMING VIOLENCE.


12 WHEREAS, the Mayor's Local Action Plan for juvenile justice reform has been approved by the City  
13 and County of San Francisco and the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council (MCJC) has been designated as the  
14 lead coordinating agency; and,

15 WHEREAS, on September 16, 1998 the U.S. Department of Justice OJP awarded the City and County  
16 of San Francisco \$534,337, under the Violence Against Women Act Grant Program, to support services to  
17 young women offenders who have been victims of sexual and domestic abuse, through the Life Learning  
18 Residential Center for Girls and (2) provide for effective batterers' intervention services to young men by  
19 providing resources to the Juvenile Probation Department and an anti-violence community based  
20 organization, Men Overcoming Violence; and,

21 WHEREAS, the entire award by the U.S. Department of Justice OJP, under the Violence Against  
22 Women Act Grant Program, funds direct services, it is requested that indirect costs be waived; now,  
23 therefore, be it




