

1 [Accept – Expend State Grant]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the Mayor’s Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) to accept and**
4 **expend funds in the amount of \$38,014 from the State Board of Corrections (BOC),**
5 **from funds made available under the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act**
6 **of 1974 (“Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funds”) for developing and adopting**
7 **policies and programs to provide basic health, mental health, and appropriate**
8 **education services, including special education, for youth in the juvenile justice**
9 **system.**

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11 WHEREAS, MOCJ is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency of the county in
12 administering Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funds, which have been provided by the
13 State Board of Corrections for the purpose of augmenting the county’s Comprehensive Multi-
14 agency Juvenile Justice Plan (CMJJ Plan); and

15 WHEREAS, The BOC has determined that Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge Funds
16 will be made available to counties pursuant to the provisions of the Juvenile Justice Crime
17 Prevention Act (JJCPA), which requires that the county’s local Juvenile Justice Coordinating
18 Council, whose membership is described in Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions
19 Code, update its CMJJ Plan and develop an annual expenditure plan for these funds; and

20 WHEREAS, The City originally established the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council
21 through resolution 170-97; and

22 WHEREAS, On March 25, 2004 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, chaired by
23 the Chief Probation Officer, met and developed San Francisco’s 2004-2005 CMJJ Plan and
24 expenditure plan for the 2004 allocation of JJCPA and Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge
25 funds; and

1 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors approved San Francisco's 2004-2005 annual
2 CMJJ Plan and expenditure plan for JJCPA funds through resolution 040482; now, therefore
3 be it

4 RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes MOCJ to
5 accept and expend \$38,014 in Federal Juvenile Justice Challenge funds from the State Board
6 of Corrections, for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in
7 reducing delinquency; and

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the Director of the Mayor's Office of Criminal
9 Justice is authorized to sign the City and County of San Francisco's Application for Approval
10 for the County's CMJJ Plan and related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State
11 of California; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the City and County of San Francisco assures that
13 the Board of Supervisors and Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council have reviewed and
14 approved the county's 2004-2005 CMJJ Plan; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the City and County of San Francisco assures that
16 its CMJJ Plan has been developed, reviewed and provided to the Board of Corrections in a
17 format determined by the Board of Corrections; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That any liability arising out of the performance of the
19 Grant Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility
20 of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency; and

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the City and County of San Francisco will adhere to
22 the requirements of JJCPA and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974,
23 as amended, regarding the submission of the Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile Justice
24 Plan application or revision, investment of allocated monies, including any interest earnings,
25 expenditure of said funds, and the submission of required reports to the Board of Corrections.
