SFDPH Divisions

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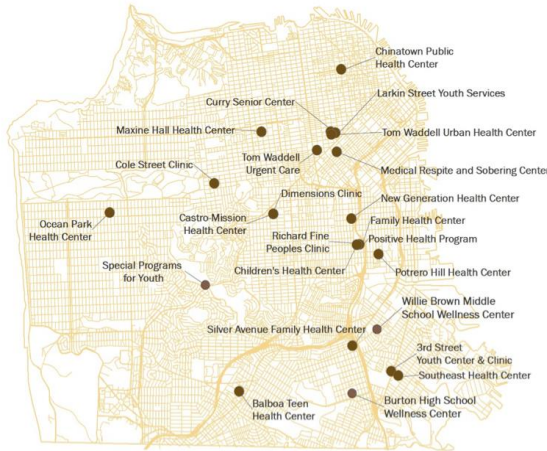
- **Population Health Division (PHD)** – addresses public health concerns, including consumer safety, health promotion and prevention, and the monitoring of threats to the public’s health. PHD implements traditional and innovative public health interventions. PHD staff inspect restaurants, promote improved air and water quality, track communicable diseases, and educate San Franciscans about the negative health impacts of tobacco. PHD staff also promote pedestrian safety, participate in an ambitious campaign to eliminate new HIV infections, and provide technical assistance to small neighborhood markets to increase healthy food options for residents.
- **The San Francisco Health Network (SFHN)** – a network of top-rated clinics, hospitals and programs operated by SFDPH. SFHN connects San Franciscans to quality health care, regardless of immigration status or lack of health insurance. SFHN direct service providers consist of Zuckerberg SF General (ZSFG); Laguna Honda Hospital (LHH); Primary Care (PC); Behavioral Health Services (BHS); Jail Health Services (JHS), Whole Person Integrated Care (WPIC), Home Health (HH); and Dental Care. Every year, SFHN serves more than 100,000 people through SFHN clinics and hospitals.

PRIMARY CARE SERVICES SITES

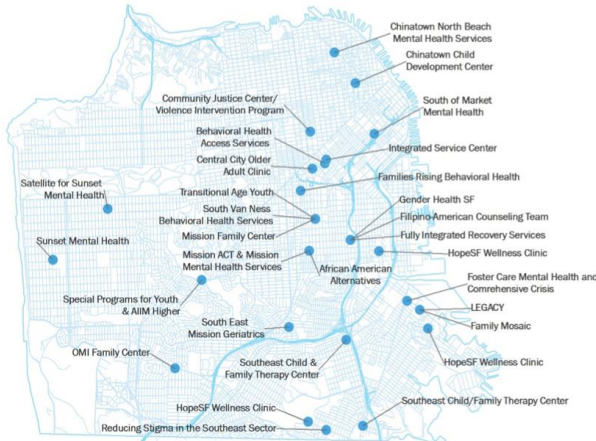
*Castro-Mission Health Center and Dimensions Clinic temporarily located at ZSFG during FY 21-22

- SFDPH provides more than **\$8 million in funding to seven programs/service sites** located directly in the communities of Lakeview, Oceanview, Merced Heights and Ingleside.
- SFDPH currently provides **funding for an additional 12 programs located in District 11** near the Lakeview, Oceanview, Merced Heights, and Ingleside communities.
- In the last two years, **approximately 10,000 residents of zip code 94112 and approximately 1,700 residents of zip code 94132** received SFDPH primary care or specialty care services.

DPH Services Located Directly in Oceanview, Merced Heights, Ingleside and Lakeview

OMI Family Center | FY21-22: \$5,209,165

Comprehensive clinic providing full range outpatient mental health services including assessment, psychiatric evaluation, medication, counseling, psychotherapy and case management services.

The Latino Commission (TLC): Casa Ollin Adult Male Residential | FY21-22: \$599,713

A residential step-down program offering clients a safe, temporary sober living for adult men who successfully completed a 90-day residential program.

Seneca San Francisco Connections Dialectical Behavioral Therapy Program | FY22-23: \$1,399,970

Program providing individual therapy, family therapy, and multi-family group skills training, and access to after-hours phone coaching.

Instituto Familiar de la Raza (IFR): COVID-19 LatinX Community Response Collaborative | FY21-22: \$712,500

IFR provides community outreach and education, focusing on COVID-19 and Monkeypox, and access to vaccinations for both diseases.

Community Health Equity & Promotion: Health Disparities Program | Dec 2022-May 2023: \$6,000 (2 orgs.)

A stipend of \$6,000 to two community-based organizations to participate in Community Referral Network planning, with the aim of developing a SF Community Referral Network that supports connections and referrals among CBOs that provide wrap-around services.

San Francisco African American Faith Based Coalition – Healthy Eating Program | Jul. 2019 – Jun. 2023: \$774,759

Funding builds capacity to provide services and serve at least 450 people over the three-year cycle with healthy food training and food security
