5	WHEREAS, Diabetes is a serious and growing epidemic in America, especially among
6	women; and
7	WHEREAS, One million new cases of diabetes are diagnosed each year; and,
8	WHEREAS, Minority women are at 2-4 times higher risk of developing diabetes; and,
9	WHEREAS, 1 in 20 women will develop diabetes while pregnant; and,
10	WHEREAS, More than 9 million American women have diabetes and three million of
11	them are not even aware of it; and,
12	WHEREAS, Women are more likely to develop diabetes than men and to experience
13	more serious complications, including heart disease and problems in pregnancy; and,
14	WHEREAS, Women with diabetes are more likely to have a heart attack and have it at
15	a younger age; and,
16	WHEREAS, Diabetes can lead to severe complications, including heart disease,
17	blindness, kidney failure, and lower-extremity amputations; and,
18	WHEREAS, Most people with diabetes die from heart attack or stroke; and,
19	WHEREAS, In the fight against diabetes, it is important that people increase their
20	awareness of the risk factors and symptoms related to diabetes; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors proclaims the month of
22	February 2004 as National Diabetes Month.
