5	WHEREAS, Over 250,000 Filipino veterans fought under the auspices of the United
6	States Armed Forces during World War II: and,
7 8	WHEREAS, Filipino veterans who served under the U.S. Armed Forces were denied
9	full veteran' status and eligibility for veterans benefits under the Surplus Appropriation
10	Rescission Act of 1946; and,
11	WHEREAS, An overwhelming majority of the approximately 12,000 Filipino veterans
12	who are U.S. citizens receive minimum benefits and die at a 57 percent higher rate than their
13	American counterparts due to the lack of access to Veterans Affairs (VA) medical facilities;
14	and,
15 16	WHEREAS, In1990, Congress passed legislation that allowed Filipino World War II
17	veterans who proved their honorable military service to become naturalized U.S. citizens; and
18	WHEREAS, The current Congress is considering HR 677, the Filipino Veterans Equity
19	Act of 2003, which would effectively restore veterans eligibility status to Filipino veterans who
20	served under the U.S. Armed Forces during World War II; now, therefore be it
21	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
22	urges the 108 th U.S. Congress to pass the Filipino Veterans Equity Act of 2003 during the
2324	current session and provide long overdue recognition and support to the Filipino men who
25	bravely risked their lives during World War II in the service of the United States.
