6 WHEREAS, The International Imperial Court System of the United States, Canada, and
7 Mexico, founded in 1965, has since its founding organized several significant campaigns to
8 achieve federal recognition and visibility for historic LGBTQ+ icons and trailblazers; and

9 WHEREAS, The International Imperial Court System sponsored a successful initiative
10 to issue a U.S. commemorative stamp for Harvey Milk, unveiled in May 2014 at the White
11 House by former President Barack Obama, and is also responsible for a campaign that
12 resulted in the U.S. Navy's naming of the U.S.N.S. Harvey Milk; and

13 WHEREAS, A coalition of organizations and leaders convened by the International
14 Imperial Court System, including California Senate President pro Tempore Toni Atkins, Cleve
15 Jones, Stuart Milk, the Matthew Shepard Foundation, and Bruce Cohen have formed the
16 Matthew Shepard Stamp Campaign to honor Matthew Shepard through a commemorative
17 stamp; and

18 WHEREAS, Matthew Shepard was born on December 1, 1976 in Casper, Wyoming
19 and grew into a young man passionate about equality and human rights; and

20 WHEREAS, His tragic murder in 1998, one of the most notorious anti-gay hate crimes
21 in our nation's history, became the catalyst for significant shift in public awareness and policy,
22 leading to the enactment of the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr. Hate Crimes
23 Prevention Act, a landmark piece of legislation that provides federal protections for violent
24 acts based on actual or perceived gender, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identify; and
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1 WHEREAS, Issuing a commemorative stamp in Matthew Shepard's honor would
2 memorialize his life and legacy and also serve as a reminder of our ongoing responsibility to
3 champion the values of acceptance and equality; and

4 WHEREAS, Such a stamp would symbolically represent our collective stand against
