1	[Resolution Requesting Police Department to End Vehicle Impounding]
2	
3	Resolution urging the San Francisco Police Department to temporarily cease the
4	impoundment of vehicles for lack of a valid Driver's License, pending City Attorney
5	review of current law.
6	
7	WHEREAS, In Miranda v. City of Cornelius and People v. Williams, the courts have
8	ruled as unconstitutional the impoundment of vehicles on the sole charge of driving without a
9	license, citing a violation of the Fourth and Fourteenth Amendments;
10	WHEREAS, Such jurisdictions as Sonoma County and The City of Los Angeles have
11	imposed moratoriums on impounding the vehicles of unlicensed drivers; and,
12	WHEREAS, The impoundment of vehicles creates a disproportionate impact on the
13	poor, on racial and ethnic minorities, and on undocumented residents; and,
14	WHEREAS, Cars are vital for family transportation, without which those individuals
15	cannot get to work, school, church or go shopping; and,
16	WHEREAS, Vehicles are impounded regardless of whether public safety is at risk; and
17	WHEREAS, An impounded vehicle is often community property and it is unfair to the
18	non-driving spouse to deprive them of his or her property; and
19	WHEREAS, Vehicle impound fees impose an immense financial burden upon those
20	people that are least able to afford it; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
22	hereby requests that the San Francisco Police Department temporarily suspend vehicle
23	impoundment for lack of a valid driver's license, pending City Attorney review, where there is
24	no risk to public safety, where there is no imminent risk of a repeat offense, and where there
25	is no obstruction of the movement of traffic; and, be it

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
2	Francisco requests that the City Attorney review all applicable laws and counsel the Board as
3	to whether vehicle impoundment is required where the sole issue is lack of a valid driver's
4	license and where there is no risk to public safety.
